**A BILL FOR**

1 An Act relating to and making appropriations to the department  
2 of cultural affairs, the department of economic development,  
3 certain board of regents institutions, the department of  
4 workforce development, and the public employment relations  
5 board, and related matters and including immediate effective  
6 date provisions.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. DEPARTMENT OF CULTURAL AFFAIRS. There is  
2 appropriated from the general fund of the state to the  
3 department of cultural affairs for the fiscal year beginning  
4 July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2012, the following amounts,  
5 or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes  
6 designated:

7 1. ADMINISTRATION

8 For salaries, support, maintenance, miscellaneous purposes,  
9 and for not more than the following full-time equivalent  
10 positions for the department:

11 .....	\$	181,813
12 .....	FTEs	74.50

13 The department of cultural affairs shall coordinate  
14 activities with the tourism office of the department of  
15 economic development to promote attendance at the state  
16 historical building and at this state's historic sites.

17 Full-time equivalent positions authorized under this  
18 subsection shall be funded, in full or in part, using moneys  
19 appropriated under this subsection and subsections 3 through 7.

20 2. COMMUNITY CULTURAL GRANTS

21 For planning and programming for the community cultural  
22 grants program established under section 303.3:

23 .....	\$	257,090
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24 3. HISTORICAL DIVISION

25 For the support of the historical division:

26 .....	\$	2,767,701
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27 4. HISTORIC SITES

28 For the administration and support of historic sites:

29 .....	\$	426,398
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30 5. ARTS DIVISION

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33 6. IOWA GREAT PLACES

13 Sec. 2. GOALS AND ACCOUNTABILITY — ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT.

14 1. For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2011, the goals for

15 the department of economic development shall be to expand and

16 stimulate the state economy, increase the wealth of Iowans, and

17 increase the population of the state.

18 2. To achieve the goals in subsection 1, the department

19 of economic development shall do all of the following for the

20 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2011:

21 a. Concentrate its efforts on programs and activities that

22 result in commercially viable products and services.

23 b. Adopt practices and services consistent with free

24 market, private sector philosophies.

25 c. Ensure economic growth and development throughout the

26 state.

27 d. Work with businesses and communities to continually

28 improve the economic development climate along with the

29 economic well-being and quality of life for Iowans.

30 e. Coordinate with other state agencies to ensure that they

31 are attentive to the needs of an entrepreneurial culture.

32 f. Establish a strong and aggressive marketing image to

33 showcase Iowa's workforce, existing industry, and potential.

34 A priority shall be placed on recruiting new businesses,

35 business expansion, and retaining existing Iowa businesses.

1 Emphasis shall be placed on entrepreneurial development through  
2 helping entrepreneurs secure capital, and developing networks  
3 and a business climate conducive to entrepreneurs and small  
4 businesses.

5 g. Encourage the development of communities and quality of  
6 life to foster economic growth.

7 h. Prepare communities for future growth and development  
8 through development, expansion, and modernization of  
9 infrastructure.

10 i. Develop public-private partnerships with Iowa businesses  
11 in the tourism industry, Iowa tour groups, Iowa tourism  
12 organizations, and political subdivisions in this state to  
13 assist in the development of advertising efforts.

14 j. Develop, to the fullest extent possible, cooperative  
15 efforts for advertising with contributions from other sources.

16 Sec. 3. DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT.

17 1. APPROPRIATION

18 There is appropriated from the general fund of the state  
19 to the department of economic development for the fiscal year  
20 beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2012, the following  
21 amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the  
22 purposes designated in subsection 2, and for not more than the  
23 following full-time equivalent positions:

24 .....	\$ 10,047,229
25 .....	FTEs 149.00

26 2. DESIGNATED PURPOSES

27 a. For salaries, support, miscellaneous purposes, programs,  
28 and the maintenance of an administration division, a business  
29 development division, and a community development division.

30 b. The full-time equivalent positions authorized under this  
31 section shall be funded, in whole or in part, by the moneys  
32 appropriated under subsection 1 or by other moneys received by  
33 the department, including certain federal moneys.

34 c. For business development operations and programs, the  
35 film office, international trade, export assistance, workforce



1 recruitment, and the partner state program.

2 d. For transfer to the strategic investment fund created in  
3 section 15.313.

4 e. For transfer to the grow Iowa values fund created in  
5 section 15G.111.

6 f. For community economic development programs, tourism  
7 operations, community assistance, plans for Iowa green corps  
8 and summer youth programs, the mainstreet and rural mainstreet  
9 programs, the school-to-career program, the community  
10 development block grant, and housing and shelter-related  
11 programs.

12 g. For achieving the goals and accountability, and  
13 fulfilling the requirements and duties required under this Act.

14 3. NONREVERSION

15 Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in  
16 subsection 1 that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the  
17 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain  
18 available for expenditure for the purposes designated in  
19 subsection 2 until the close of the succeeding fiscal year.

20 4. FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE RESTRICTIONS

21 a. A business creating jobs through moneys appropriated in  
22 this section shall be subject to contract provisions requiring  
23 new and retained jobs to be filled by individuals who are  
24 citizens of the United States who reside within the United  
25 States or any person authorized to work in the United States  
26 pursuant to federal law, including legal resident aliens in the  
27 United States.

28 b. Any vendor who receives moneys appropriated in this  
29 section shall adhere to such contract provisions and provide  
30 periodic assurances as the state shall require that the jobs  
31 are filled solely by citizens of the United States who reside  
32 within the United States or any person authorized to work in  
33 the United States pursuant to federal law, including legal  
34 resident aliens in the United States.

35 c. A business that receives financial assistance from the

1 department from moneys appropriated in this section shall  
2 only employ individuals legally authorized to work in this  
3 state. In addition to all other applicable penalties provided  
4 by current law, all or a portion of the assistance received  
5 by a business which is found to knowingly employ individuals  
6 not legally authorized to work in this state is subject to  
7 recapture by the department.

8 5. USES OF APPROPRIATIONS

9 a. From the moneys appropriated in this section, the  
10 department may provide financial assistance in the form of a  
11 grant to a community economic development entity for conducting  
12 a local workforce recruitment effort designed to recruit former  
13 citizens of the state and former students at colleges and  
14 universities in the state to meet the needs of local employers.

15 b. From the moneys appropriated in this section, the  
16 department may provide financial assistance to early stage  
17 industry companies being established by women entrepreneurs.

18 c. From the moneys appropriated in this section, the  
19 department may provide financial assistance in the form of  
20 grants, loans, or forgivable loans for advanced research and  
21 commercialization projects involving value-added agriculture,  
22 advanced technology, or biotechnology.

23 6. WORLD FOOD PRIZE

24 For allocating moneys for the world food prize and  
25 notwithstanding the standing appropriation in section 15.368,  
26 subsection 1:

27 ..... \$ 650,000

28 7. MAIN STREET GRANTS

29 For use as matching funds for the United States department of  
30 housing and urban development's main street challenge grants  
31 for historic building preservation:

32 ..... \$ 155,828

33 Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in this  
34 subsection that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the close  
35 of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain available

1 for expenditure for the purposes designated until the close of  
2 the succeeding fiscal year.

3 8. IOWA COMMISSION ON VOLUNTEER SERVICE

4 For allocation to the Iowa commission on volunteer service  
5 for the Iowa's promise and mentoring partnership programs, for  
6 transfer to the Iowa state commission grant program, and for  
7 not more than the following full-time equivalent positions:

8 .....	\$	178,133
9 .....	FTEs	4.00

10 Of the moneys appropriated in this subsection, the  
11 department shall allocate \$75,000 for purposes of the Iowa  
12 state commission grant program and \$103,133 for purposes of the  
13 Iowa's promise and mentoring partnership programs.

14 Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in this  
15 subsection that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the close  
16 of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain available  
17 for expenditure for the purposes designated until the close of  
18 the succeeding fiscal year.

19 Sec. 4. VISION IOWA PROGRAM — FTE AUTHORIZATION. For  
20 purposes of administrative duties associated with the vision  
21 Iowa program, the department of economic development is  
22 authorized an additional 2.25 FTEs above those otherwise  
23 authorized in this Act.

24 Sec. 5. INSURANCE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT. From the moneys  
25 collected by the division of insurance in excess of the  
26 anticipated gross revenues under section 505.7, subsection 3,  
27 during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2011, \$100,000 shall  
28 be transferred to the department of economic development for  
29 insurance economic development and international insurance  
30 economic development.

31 Sec. 6. COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT LOAN FUND. Notwithstanding  
32 section 15E.120, subsection 5, there is appropriated from the  
33 Iowa community development loan fund all moneys available  
34 during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2011, and ending  
35 June 30, 2012, to the department of economic development for

1 purposes of the community development program.

2 Sec. 7. WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT FUND. There is appropriated  
3 from the workforce development fund account created in section  
4 15.342A to the workforce development fund created in section  
5 15.343 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2011, and ending  
6 June 30, 2012, the following amount, for purposes of the  
7 workforce development fund:

8 ..... \$ 4,000,000

9 Sec. 8. WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT ADMINISTRATION. From moneys  
10 appropriated or transferred to or receipts credited to the  
11 workforce development fund created in section 15.343, up to  
12 \$400,000 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2011, and ending  
13 June 30, 2012, are appropriated to the department of economic  
14 development for the administration of workforce development  
15 activities including salaries, support, maintenance, and  
16 miscellaneous purposes, and for not more than the following  
17 full-time equivalent positions:

18 ..... FTEs 4.00

19 Sec. 9. JOB TRAINING FUND. Notwithstanding section 15.251,  
20 all moneys in the job training fund on July 1, 2011, and any  
21 moneys appropriated or credited to the fund during the fiscal  
22 year beginning July 1, 2011, shall be transferred to the  
23 workforce development fund established pursuant to section  
24 15.343.

25 Sec. 10. IOWA STATE UNIVERSITY.

26 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state  
27 to Iowa state university of science and technology for the  
28 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2012,  
29 the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to  
30 be used for small business development centers, the science  
31 and technology research park, and the institute for physical  
32 research and technology, and for not more than the following  
33 full-time equivalent positions:

34 ..... \$ 2,575,983

35 ..... FTEs 56.63

1     2. Of the moneys appropriated in subsection 1, Iowa state  
2 university of science and technology shall allocate at least  
3 \$994,929 for purposes of funding small business development  
4 centers. Iowa state university of science and technology may  
5 allocate moneys appropriated in subsection 1 to the various  
6 small business development centers in any manner necessary to  
7 achieve the purposes of this subsection.

8     3. Iowa state university of science and technology shall do  
9 all of the following:

10    a. Direct expenditures for research toward projects that  
11 will provide economic stimulus for Iowa.

12    b. Provide emphasis to providing services to Iowa-based  
13 companies.

14     4. It is the intent of the general assembly that the  
15 industrial incentive program focus on Iowa industrial  
16 sectors and seek contributions and in-kind donations from  
17 businesses, industrial foundations, and trade associations,  
18 and that moneys for the institute for physical research and  
19 technology industrial incentive program shall be allocated  
20 only for projects which are matched by private sector moneys  
21 for directed contract research or for nondirected research.  
22 The match required of small businesses as defined in section  
23 15.102, subsection 6, for directed contract research or for  
24 nondirected research shall be \$1 for each \$3 of state funds.  
25 The match required for other businesses for directed contract  
26 research or for nondirected research shall be \$1 for each \$1 of  
27 state funds. The match required of industrial foundations or  
28 trade associations shall be \$1 for each \$1 of state funds.

29     Iowa state university of science and technology shall  
30 report annually to the joint appropriations subcommittee on  
31 economic development and the legislative services agency the  
32 total amount of private contributions, the proportion of  
33 contributions from small businesses and other businesses, and  
34 the proportion for directed contract research and nondirected  
35 research of benefit to Iowa businesses and industrial sectors.

1 5. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in  
2 this section that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the  
3 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain  
4 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the  
5 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

6 Sec. 11. UNIVERSITY OF IOWA.

7 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state  
8 to the state university of Iowa for the fiscal year beginning  
9 July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2012, the following amount,  
10 or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the state  
11 university of Iowa research park and for the advanced drug  
12 development program at the Oakdale research park, including  
13 salaries, support, maintenance, equipment, miscellaneous  
14 purposes, and for not more than the following full-time  
15 equivalent positions:

16 .....	\$	222,372
17 .....	FTEs	6.00

18 2. The state university of Iowa shall do all of the  
19 following:

- 20 a. Direct expenditures for research toward projects that
- 21 will provide economic stimulus for Iowa.
- 22 b. Provide emphasis to providing services to Iowa-based
- 23 companies.

24 3. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in  
25 this section that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the  
26 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain  
27 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the  
28 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

29 Sec. 12. UNIVERSITY OF NORTHERN IOWA.

30 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the  
31 state to the university of northern Iowa for the fiscal year  
32 beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2012, the following  
33 amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the  
34 metal casting institute, the MyEntreNet internet application,  
35 and the institute of decision making, including salaries,

1 support, maintenance, miscellaneous purposes, and for not more  
2 than the following full-time equivalent positions:

3 .....	\$	610,674
4 .....	FTEs	6.75

5 2. Of the moneys appropriated pursuant to subsection 1, the  
6 university of northern Iowa shall allocate at least \$290,494  
7 for purposes of expanded support of entrepreneurs through the  
8 university's regional business center.

9 3. The university of northern Iowa shall do all of the  
10 following:

11 a. Direct expenditures for research toward projects that  
12 will provide economic stimulus for Iowa.

13 b. Provide emphasis to providing services to Iowa-based  
14 companies.

15 4. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in  
16 this section that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the  
17 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain  
18 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the  
19 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

20 Sec. 13. BOARD OF REGENTS REPORT. The state board of  
21 regents shall submit a report on the progress of regents  
22 institutions in meeting the strategic plan for technology  
23 transfer and economic development to the secretary of the  
24 senate, the chief clerk of the house of representatives, and  
25 the legislative services agency by January 15, 2012.

26 Sec. 14. DEPARTMENT OF WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT. There  
27 is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the  
28 department of workforce development for the fiscal year  
29 beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2012, the following  
30 amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, for the purposes  
31 designated:

32 1. DIVISION OF LABOR SERVICES

33 a. For the division of labor services, including salaries,  
34 support, maintenance, miscellaneous purposes, and for not more  
35 than the following full-time equivalent positions:

1 ..... \$ 2,951,367

2 ..... FTEs 64.00

3 b. From the contractor registration fees, the division of  
4 labor services shall reimburse the department of inspections  
5 and appeals for all costs associated with hearings under  
6 chapter 91C, relating to contractor registration.

7 2. DIVISION OF WORKERS' COMPENSATION

8 a. For the division of workers' compensation, including  
9 salaries, support, maintenance, miscellaneous purposes, and for  
10 not more than the following full-time equivalent positions:

11 ..... \$ 2,575,151

12 ..... FTEs 30.00

13 b. The division of workers' compensation shall charge a  
14 \$100 filing fee for workers' compensation cases. The filing  
15 fee shall be paid by the petitioner of a claim. However, the  
16 fee can be taxed as a cost and paid by the losing party, except  
17 in cases where it would impose an undue hardship or be unjust  
18 under the circumstances. The moneys generated by the filing  
19 fee allowed under this subsection are appropriated to the  
20 department of workforce development to be used for purposes of  
21 administering the division of workers' compensation.

22 3. WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT OPERATIONS

23 a. For the operation of field offices, the workforce  
24 development board, and for not more than the following  
25 full-time equivalent positions:

26 ..... \$ 9,707,042

27 ..... FTEs 130.00

28 b. Of the moneys appropriated in paragraph "a" of this  
29 subsection, the department shall allocate \$9,696,170 for the  
30 operation of field offices.

31 c. The department shall not reduce the number of field  
32 offices below the number of field offices being operated as of  
33 January 1, 2009.

34 4. OFFENDER REENTRY PROGRAM

35 a. For the development and administration of an offender



1 reentry program to provide offenders with employment skills,  
2 and for not more than the following full-time equivalent  
3 positions:

4 .....	\$	284,464
5 .....	FTEs	3.00

6 b. The department shall partner with the department of  
7 corrections to provide staff within the correctional facilities  
8 to improve offenders' abilities to find and retain productive  
9 employment.

10 5. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in  
11 this section that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the  
12 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain  
13 available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the  
14 close of the succeeding fiscal year.

15 Sec. 15. ACCOUNTABILITY — AUDIT. The auditor of state  
16 shall annually conduct an audit of the department of workforce  
17 development and shall report the findings of such annual  
18 audit, including the accountability of programs of the  
19 department, to the chairpersons and ranking members of the  
20 joint appropriations subcommittee on economic development. The  
21 department shall pay for the costs associated with the audit.

22 Sec. 16. EMPLOYMENT SECURITY CONTINGENCY FUND.

23 1. There is appropriated from the special employment  
24 security contingency fund to the department of workforce  
25 development for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2011, and  
26 ending June 30, 2012, the following amounts, or so much thereof  
27 as is necessary, for the purposes designated:

28 a. For the division of workers' compensation, salaries, 29 support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes:		
30 .....	\$	491,617

31 b. For the division of labor services, including salaries, 32 support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes:		
33 .....	\$	394,073

34 2. Any remaining additional penalty and interest revenue  
35 is appropriated to the department of workforce development to



1 information.

2 Sec. 20. IOWA FINANCE AUTHORITY.

3 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state  
4 to the Iowa finance authority for the fiscal year beginning  
5 July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2012, the following amount,  
6 or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used to provide  
7 reimbursement for rent expenses to eligible persons under the  
8 rent subsidy program:

9 ..... \$ 658,000

10 2. Participation in the rent subsidy program shall be  
11 limited to only those persons who meet the requirements for the  
12 nursing facility level of care for home and community-based  
13 services waiver services as in effect on July 1, 2011, and  
14 to those individuals who are eligible for the federal money  
15 follows the person grant program under the medical assistance  
16 program. Of the moneys appropriated in this section, not more  
17 than \$35,000 may be used for administrative costs.

18 Sec. 21. IOWA FINANCE AUTHORITY AUDIT. The auditor of state  
19 is requested to review the audit of the Iowa finance authority  
20 performed by the auditor hired by the authority.

21 Sec. 22. UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION PROGRAM. Notwithstanding  
22 section 96.9, subsection 4, paragraph "a", moneys credited to  
23 the state by the secretary of the treasury of the United  
24 States pursuant to section 903 of the Social Security  
25 Act are appropriated to the department of workforce  
26 development and shall be used by the department for the  
27 administration of the unemployment compensation program only.  
28 This appropriation shall not apply to any fiscal year  
29 beginning after December 31, 2011.

30 Sec. 23. 2010 Iowa Acts, chapter 1184, section 37, is  
31 amended by adding the following new unnumbered paragraph:

32 NEW UNNUMBERED PARAGRAPH. Notwithstanding section 8.33,  
33 moneys appropriated in this section shall not revert at the  
34 close of the fiscal year for which they are appropriated but  
35 shall remain available for the purposes designated until

1 the close of the fiscal year that begins July 1, 2011. The  
2 full-time equivalent position authorized in this section shall  
3 continue to be authorized until the close of the fiscal year  
4 that begins July 1, 2011.

5 Sec. 24. 2010 Iowa Acts, chapter 1193, section 88, is  
6 amended to read as follows:

7 SEC. 88. TAIWAN TRADE OFFICE — IOWA COMPREHENSIVE  
8 PETROLEUM UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANK FUND. There is appropriated  
9 from the Iowa comprehensive petroleum underground storage tank  
10 fund to the department of economic development for the fiscal  
11 year beginning July 1, 2010, and ending June 30, 2011, the  
12 following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be  
13 used for the purposes designated:

14 Notwithstanding section 455G.3, subsection 1, for  
15 establishing a trade office in Taipei, Taiwan:

16 ..... \$ 100,000

17 Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in this  
18 section shall not revert at the close of the fiscal year for  
19 which they are appropriated but shall remain available for the  
20 purposes designated until the close of the fiscal year that  
21 begins July 1, 2011.

22 If the department cannot arrange for matching moneys from  
23 another source by June 30, 2012, in an amount at least equal to  
24 the appropriation made in this section, the moneys appropriated  
25 in this section shall revert to the Iowa comprehensive  
26 petroleum underground storage tank fund.

27 Sec. 25. 2008 Iowa Acts, chapter 1190, section 30,  
28 subsection 3, is amended to read as follows:

29 3. As part of the plan, the department of workforce  
30 development shall set a goal of having at least one certified  
31 one-stop center in each of the fifteen workforce regions by the  
32 year ~~2012~~ 2014.

33 Sec. 26. EFFECTIVE UPON ENACTMENT. The sections of this  
34 Act amending 2010 Iowa Acts, chapter 1184, 2010 Iowa Acts,  
35 chapter 1193, and 2008 Iowa Acts, chapter 1190, being deemed of

1 immediate importance, take effect upon enactment.

EXPLANATION

3 This bill makes appropriations and transfers from the  
4 general fund of the state and other funds to the department of  
5 cultural affairs, the department of economic development, the  
6 university of Iowa, the university of northern Iowa, Iowa state  
7 university, the department of workforce development, the Iowa  
8 finance authority, and the public employment relations board  
9 for the 2011-2012 fiscal year.

10 The bill provides that the goals for the department of  
11 economic development shall be to expand and stimulate the  
12 state economy, increase the wealth of Iowans, and increase the  
13 population of the state.

14 The bill transfers moneys collected by the division of  
15 insurance in excess of the anticipated gross revenues to the  
16 department of economic development for purposes of insurance  
17 economic development and international insurance economic  
18 development.

19 The bill appropriates moneys from the Iowa community  
20 development loan fund to the department of economic development  
21 for purposes of the community development program.

22 The bill appropriates moneys from the workforce development  
23 fund account to the workforce development fund.

24 The bill provides that moneys appropriated or transferred  
25 to or receipts credited to the workforce development fund are  
26 appropriated to the department of economic development for  
27 administration of workforce development activities.

28 The bill provides that all moneys in the job training fund on  
29 July 1, 2010, and any moneys appropriated or credited to the  
30 fund during the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2010, shall be  
31 transferred to the workforce development fund.

32 The bill requires the state board of regents to submit a  
33 report on the progress of regents institutions in meeting  
34 the strategic plan for technology transfer and economic  
35 development.

1 The bill requires the auditor of state to conduct an audit of  
2 the department of workforce development.

3 The bill appropriates moneys from the special employment  
4 security contingency fund to the department of workforce  
5 development for the division of workers' compensation and the  
6 division of labor.

7 The bill appropriates interest earned on the unemployment  
8 compensation reserve fund to the department of workforce  
9 development for the operation of field offices.

10 The bill appropriates moneys to the department of workforce  
11 development for an employee misclassification program.

12 The bill requests the auditor of state to review the audit  
13 of the Iowa finance authority performed by the auditor hired  
14 by the authority.

15 The bill appropriates moneys from moneys credited to  
16 the state by the secretary of the treasury of the United  
17 States pursuant to the Social Security Act to the department  
18 of workforce development for the administration of the  
19 unemployment compensation program only.

20 The bill amends 2010 Iowa Acts, chapter 1184, section 37, by  
21 adding nonreversion language. This amendment is effective upon  
22 enactment.

23 The bill amends 2010 Iowa Acts, chapter 1193, section 88,  
24 by adding nonreversion language and by providing for a future  
25 reversion date. This amendment is effective upon enactment.

26 The bill amends 2008 Iowa Acts, chapter 1190, section 30,  
27 relating to workforce innovation centers by extending by two  
28 years the date by which the department of workforce development  
29 must have at least one certified one-stop center in each of the  
30 15 workforce regions of the state. This amendment is effective  
31 upon enactment.
