A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to and making appropriations to state
2 departments and agencies from the rebuild Iowa
3 infrastructure fund, the technology reinvestment fund, and
4 the FY 2009 prison bonding fund, providing for related
5 matters, and including effective date and retroactive
6 applicability provisions.
7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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DIVISION I

REBUILD IOWA INFRASTRUCTURE FUND

Section 1. There is appropriated from the rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund to the following departments and agencies for the following fiscal years the following amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes designated:

1. DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND LAND STEWARDSHIP

a. For deposit in the agricultural drainage well water quality assistance fund created in section 460.303 to be used for purposes of supporting the agricultural drainage well water quality assistance program as provided in section 460.304, notwithstanding section 8.57, subsection 6, paragraph "c":
FY 2012-2013..... \$ 500,000

b. Not more than 10 percent of the moneys appropriated in paragraph "a" may be used for costs of administration and implementation of soil and water conservation practices.

2. DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS:

a. For the provision of a statewide public safety radio network and the purchase of compatible radio communications equipment with the goal of achieving compliance with the federal communications commission's narrowbanding mandate deadline, and for achieving "interoperability", as defined in section 80.28, notwithstanding section 8.57, subsection 6, paragraph "c":
FY 2012-2013..... \$ 3,500,000

If the department of public safety enters into a public-private partnership, through a competitive bidding process, for the provision of the statewide network and the purchase of compatible equipment, the department of corrections may join that effort.

As a condition of this appropriation, all land mobile radio communications equipment purchased by the department of corrections shall be compliant with the federal communication commission's narrowbanding mandate and shall provide the

1 maximum amount of statewide coverage and interoperability,
2 throughout all phases of migration, to the department of public
3 safety's future statewide digital radio network utilizing P-25
4 standards.

5 b. For repairs and renovation of the hot water loop system
6 at the Newton correctional facility:

8 The department may use any funds appropriated to the
9 department in the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2008, and
10 succeeding fiscal years for any prison repairs, construction,

14 a. For exterior and interior repairs and related

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DIVISION IV

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DIVISION VIII

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IOWA COMMUNICATIONS NETWORK — AUDIT

18 Sec. 24. IOWA COMMUNICATIONS NETWORK — AUDIT. Prior to
19 the sale or lease of the Iowa communications network, the Iowa
20 communications network shall conduct a comprehensive audit
21 to include a complete inventory and estimate of the value
22 of all the components included in the network including all
23 fiber, switching stations, end user equipment, and individual
24 components the state has purchased since the creation of the
25 network. The audit should be conducted by an independent
26 auditing firm not associated with the vendor selected through a
27 competitive bidding process. The auditing firm selected shall
28 be technology-based, have extensive industry experience in
29 telecommunications, and be associated with a certified public
30 accountant.

EXPLANATION

32 This bill relates to and makes appropriations to state
33 departments and agencies from the rebuild Iowa infrastructure
34 fund, the technology reinvestment fund, and the FY 2009 prison
35 bonding fund, provides for related matters, and includes an

1 effective date provision. The bill is organized by divisions.
2 REBUILD IOWA INFRASTRUCTURE FUND. This division
3 appropriates project funding from the rebuild Iowa
4 infrastructure fund, including projects for FY 2012-2013
5 for the departments of agriculture and land stewardship,
6 corrections, cultural affairs, economic development authority,
7 human services, natural resources, public defense, and
8 transportation, and for the state fair authority, treasurer of
9 state, and the board of regents, and for FY 2013-2014 for the
10 departments of corrections and natural resources, and for the
11 state fair authority and the board of regents.

12 TECHNOLOGY REINVESTMENT FUND. This division appropriates
13 project funding for FY 2012-2013 from the technology
14 reinvestment fund, including projects for the departments of
15 corrections, education, human rights, and management, and for
16 the Iowa telecommunications and technology commission, and
17 board of regents.

18 FY 2009 PRISON BONDING FUND. This division appropriates
19 project funding for FY 2012-2013 from the FY 2009 prison
20 bonding fund for the department of corrections.

21 ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY — CONTINGENT APPROPRIATION.
22 This division appropriates project funding for FY 2013-2014
23 from the rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund to the economic
24 development authority for the Des Moines area regional transit
25 authority if the authority receives local funds as well as a
26 federal grant, by December 31, 2013, in an amount sufficient
27 to complete the project.

28 DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION — RADIOS. This division
29 requires all land mobile radio communications equipment
30 purchased by the department of transportation to be compliant
31 with the federal communication commission's narrowbanding
32 mandate and to provide the maximum amount of statewide coverage
33 and interoperability, throughout all phases of migration, to
34 the department of public safety's future statewide digital
35 radio network utilizing P-25 standards.

1 This division takes effect upon enactment and applies
2 retroactively to July 1, 2011.

3 CHANGES TO PRIOR APPROPRIATIONS. This division makes
4 changes to prior appropriations from the state fish and game
5 protection fund for FY 2010-2011 to the department of natural
6 resources.

7 The division makes changes to prior appropriations from
8 the rebuild Iowa infrastructure fund for FY 2011-2012 to the
9 department of veterans affairs and for the board of regents,
10 for FY 2012-2013 to the department of corrections and board of
11 regents, and for FY 2013-2014 and 2013-2014 to the department
12 of corrections and board of regents.

13 The division makes changes to prior appropriations from the
14 technology reinvestment fund for FY 2011-2012 to the department
15 of human rights and public safety and for FY 2012-2013 and FY
16 2013-2014 to the department of human services.

17 The division makes changes to prior appropriations from the
18 revenue bonds capitals fund for FY 2011-2012 to the department
19 of corrections.

20 The division takes effect upon enactment.

21 MISCELLANEOUS CODE CHANGES. This division reduces the
22 standing appropriation from the rebuild Iowa infrastructure
23 fund for FY 2012-2013 to the environment first fund from \$35
24 million to \$33 million.

25 The division provides a standing general fund appropriation
26 of \$17.5 million to the technology reinvestment fund beginning
27 in FY 2013-2014.

28 The division appropriates \$15 million from the rebuild Iowa
29 infrastructure fund to the technology reinvestment fund for FY
30 2012-2013.

31 IOWA COMMUNICATIONS NETWORK — AUDIT. This division
32 requires the Iowa communications network, prior to the sale
33 or lease of the network, to conduct a comprehensive audit
34 to include a complete inventory and estimate of the value
35 of all the components included in the network including all

1 fiber, switching stations, end user equipment, and individual
2 components the state has purchased since the creation of the
3 network. The audit should be conducted by an independent
4 auditing firm not associated with the vendor selected through a
5 competitive bidding process. The auditing firm selected shall
6 be technology-based, have extensive industry experience in
7 telecommunications, and be associated with a certified public
8 accountant.
