**A BILL FOR**

- 1 An Act relating to appropriations to the justice system.
- 2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

DRAFT

1 Section 1. 2013 Iowa Acts, chapter 139, section 19, is  
2 amended to read as follows:

3 SEC. 19. DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE.

4 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state  
5 to the department of justice for the fiscal year beginning July  
6 1, 2014, and ending June 30, 2015, the following amounts, or  
7 so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes  
8 designated:

9 a. For the general office of attorney general for salaries,  
10 support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes, including  
11 the prosecuting attorneys training program, matching funds  
12 for federal violence against women grant programs, victim  
13 assistance grants, office of drug control policy prosecuting  
14 attorney program, and odometer fraud enforcement, and for not  
15 more than the following full-time equivalent positions:

16 ..... \$ 3,983,965  
17 ..... FTEs 214.00

18 It is the intent of the general assembly that as a condition  
19 of receiving the appropriation provided in this lettered  
20 paragraph, the department of justice shall maintain a record  
21 of the estimated time incurred representing each agency or  
22 department.

23 b. For victim assistance grants:

24 ..... \$ 3,367,200

25 The funds appropriated in this lettered paragraph shall be  
26 used to provide grants to care providers providing services to  
27 crime victims of domestic abuse or to crime victims of rape and  
28 sexual assault.

29 The balance of the victim compensation fund established in  
30 section 915.94 may be used to provide salary and support of not  
31 more than 24 FTEs and to provide maintenance for the victim  
32 compensation functions of the department of justice.

33 The department of justice shall transfer at least \$150,000  
34 from the victim compensation fund established in section 915.94  
35 to the victim assistance grant program.

1 c. For legal services for persons in poverty grants as  
2 provided in section 13.34:

3 ..... \$ 1,090,281

4 2. a. The department of justice, in submitting budget  
5 estimates for the fiscal year commencing July 1, 2015, pursuant  
6 to section 8.23, shall include a report of funding from sources  
7 other than amounts appropriated directly from the general fund  
8 of the state to the department of justice or to the office of  
9 consumer advocate. These funding sources shall include but  
10 are not limited to reimbursements from other state agencies,  
11 commissions, boards, or similar entities, and reimbursements  
12 from special funds or internal accounts within the department  
13 of justice. The department of justice shall also report actual  
14 reimbursements for the fiscal year commencing July 1, 2013,  
15 and actual and expected reimbursements for the fiscal year  
16 commencing July 1, 2014.

17 b. The department of justice shall include the report  
18 required under paragraph "a", as well as information regarding  
19 any revisions occurring as a result of reimbursements actually  
20 received or expected at a later date, in a report to the  
21 co-chairpersons and ranking members of the joint appropriations  
22 subcommittee on the justice system and the legislative services  
23 agency. The department of justice shall submit the report on  
24 or before January 15, 2015.

25 Sec. 2. 2013 Iowa Acts, chapter 139, section 20, is amended  
26 to read as follows:

27 SEC. 20. OFFICE OF CONSUMER ADVOCATE. There is appropriated  
28 from the department of commerce revolving fund created in  
29 section 546.12 to the office of consumer advocate of the  
30 department of justice for the fiscal year beginning July 1,  
31 2014, and ending June 30, 2015, the following amount, or so  
32 much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes  
33 designated:

34 For salaries, support, maintenance, miscellaneous purposes,  
35 and for not more than the following full-time equivalent

4 Sec. 3. 2013 Iowa Acts, chapter 139, section 21, is amended  
5 to read as follows:

6 SEC. 21. DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS — FACILITIES.

7 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the  
8 state to the department of corrections for the fiscal year  
9 beginning July 1, 2014, and ending June 30, 2015, the following  
10 amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the  
11 operation of adult correctional institutions, reimbursement  
12 of counties for certain confinement costs, and federal prison  
13 reimbursement, to be allocated as follows:

14 a. For the operation of the Fort Madison correctional  
15 facility, including salaries, support, maintenance, and  
16 miscellaneous purposes:

29 d. For the operation of the Newton correctional facility,

33 e. For the operation of the Mt. Pleasant correctional  
34 facility, including salaries, support, maintenance, and  
35 miscellaneous purposes:

1 ..... \$ 12,405,714

2 f. For the operation of the Rockwell City correctional

3 facility, including salaries, support, maintenance, and

4 miscellaneous purposes:

5 ..... \$ 4,835,574

6 g. For the operation of the Clarinda correctional facility,

7 including salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous

8 purposes:

9 ..... \$ 12,620,808

10 Moneys received by the department of corrections as

11 reimbursement for services provided to the Clarinda youth

12 corporation are appropriated to the department and shall be

13 used for the purpose of operating the Clarinda correctional

14 facility.

15 h. For the operation of the Mitchellville correctional

16 facility, including salaries, support, maintenance, and

17 miscellaneous purposes:

18 ..... \$ 10,802,018

19 i. For the operation of the Fort Dodge correctional

20 facility, including salaries, support, maintenance, and

21 miscellaneous purposes:

22 ..... \$ 14,932,616

23 j. For reimbursement of counties for temporary confinement

24 of work release and parole violators, as provided in sections

25 901.7, 904.908, and 906.17, and for offenders confined pursuant

26 to section 904.513:

27 ..... \$ 537,546

28 k. For federal prison reimbursement, reimbursements for

29 out-of-state placements, and miscellaneous contracts:

30 ..... \$ 242,206

31 2. The department of corrections shall use moneys

32 appropriated in subsection 1 to continue to contract for the

33 services of a Muslim imam and a Native American spiritual

34 leader.

35 Sec. 4. 2013 Iowa Acts, chapter 139, section 22, is amended

1 to read as follows:

2 SEC. 22. DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS — ADMINISTRATION.

3 There is appropriated from the general fund of the state to the  
4 department of corrections for the fiscal year beginning July  
5 1, 2014, and ending June 30, 2015, the following amounts, or  
6 so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes  
7 designated:

8 1. For general administration, including salaries, support,  
9 maintenance, employment of an education director to administer  
10 a centralized education program for the correctional system,  
11 and miscellaneous purposes:

12 ..... \$ 2,540,791

13 a. It is the intent of the general assembly that each  
14 lease negotiated by the department of corrections with a  
15 private corporation for the purpose of providing private  
16 industry employment of inmates in a correctional institution  
17 shall prohibit the private corporation from utilizing inmate  
18 labor for partisan political purposes for any person seeking  
19 election to public office in this state and that a violation  
20 of this requirement shall result in a termination of the lease  
21 agreement.

22 b. It is the intent of the general assembly that as a  
23 condition of receiving the appropriation provided in this  
24 subsection the department of corrections shall not enter into  
25 a lease or contractual agreement pursuant to section 904.809  
26 with a private corporation for the use of building space for  
27 the purpose of providing inmate employment without providing  
28 that the terms of the lease or contract establish safeguards to  
29 restrict, to the greatest extent feasible, access by inmates  
30 working for the private corporation to personal identifying  
31 information of citizens.

32 2. For educational programs for inmates at state penal  
33 institutions:

34 ..... \$ 1,304,055

35 a. To maximize the funding for educational programs,

1 the department shall establish guidelines and procedures to  
2 prioritize the availability of educational and vocational  
3 training for inmates based upon the goal of facilitating an  
4 inmate's successful release from the correctional institution.

5 b. The director of the department of corrections may  
6 transfer moneys from Iowa prison industries and the canteen  
7 operating funds established pursuant to section 904.310, for  
8 use in educational programs for inmates.

9 c. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in  
10 this subsection that remain unobligated or unexpended at the  
11 close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain  
12 available to be used only for the purposes designated in this  
13 subsection until the close of the succeeding fiscal year.

14 3. For the development of the Iowa corrections offender  
15 network (ICON) data system:

16 ..... \$ 1,000,000

17 4. For offender mental health and substance abuse  
18 treatment:

19 ..... \$ 11,160

20 5. For viral hepatitis prevention and treatment:

21 ..... \$ 83,941

22 6. For operations costs and miscellaneous purposes:

23 ..... \$ 1,285,655

24 7. It is the intent of the general assembly that for  
25 the fiscal year addressed by this section the department of  
26 corrections shall continue to operate the correctional farms  
27 under the control of the department at the same or greater  
28 level of participation and involvement as existed as of January  
29 1, 2011; shall not enter into any rental agreement or contract  
30 concerning any farmland under the control of the department  
31 that is not subject to a rental agreement or contract as of  
32 January 1, 2011, without prior legislative approval; and  
33 shall further attempt to provide job opportunities at the  
34 farms for inmates. The department shall attempt to provide  
35 job opportunities at the farms for inmates by encouraging

1 labor-intensive farming or gardening where appropriate; using  
2 inmates to grow produce and meat for institutional consumption;  
3 researching the possibility of instituting food canning  
4 and cook-and-chill operations; and exploring opportunities  
5 for organic farming and gardening, livestock ventures,  
6 horticulture, and specialized crops.

7 Sec. 5. 2013 Iowa Acts, chapter 139, section 23, is amended  
8 to read as follows:

9 SEC. 23. JUDICIAL DISTRICT DEPARTMENTS OF CORRECTIONAL  
10 SERVICES.

11 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state  
12 to the department of corrections for the fiscal year beginning  
13 July 1, 2014, and ending June 30, 2015, for salaries, support,  
14 maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes, the following amounts,  
15 or so much thereof as is necessary, to be allocated as follows:

16 a. For the first judicial district department of  
17 correctional services:

18 ..... \$ 7,049,543

19 b. For the second judicial district department of  
20 correctional services:

21 ..... \$ 5,435,213

22 c. For the third judicial district department of  
23 correctional services:

6 2. Each judicial district department of correctional  
7 services, within the funding available, shall continue programs  
8 and plans established within that district to provide for  
9 intensive supervision, sex offender treatment, diversion of  
10 low-risk offenders to the least restrictive sanction available,  
11 job development, and expanded use of intermediate criminal  
12 sanctions.

13 3. Each judicial district department of correctional  
14 services shall provide alternatives to prison consistent with  
15 chapter 901B. The alternatives to prison shall ensure public  
16 safety while providing maximum rehabilitation to the offender.  
17 A judicial district department of correctional services may  
18 also establish a day program.

19 4. The governor's office of drug control policy shall  
20 consider federal grants made to the department of corrections  
21 for the benefit of each of the eight judicial district  
22 departments of correctional services as local government  
23 grants, as defined pursuant to federal regulations.

24 5. The department of corrections shall continue to contract  
25 with a judicial district department of correctional services to  
26 provide for the rental of electronic monitoring equipment which  
27 shall be available statewide.

28 Sec. 6. 2013 Iowa Acts, chapter 139, section 24, is amended  
29 to read as follows:

30 SEC. 24. DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS — REALLOCATION OF  
31 APPROPRIATIONS. Notwithstanding section 8.39, within the  
32 moneys appropriated in this division of this Act to the  
33 department of corrections, the department may reallocate the  
34 moneys appropriated and allocated as necessary to best fulfill  
35 the needs of the correctional institutions, administration

1 of the department, and the judicial district departments of  
2 correctional services. However, in addition to complying with  
3 the requirements of sections 904.116 and 905.8 and providing  
4 notice to the legislative services agency, the department  
5 of corrections shall also provide notice to the department  
6 of management, prior to the effective date of the revision  
7 or reallocation of an appropriation made pursuant to this  
8 section. The department of corrections shall not reallocate an  
9 appropriation or allocation for the purpose of eliminating any  
10 program.

11 Sec. 7. 2013 Iowa Acts, chapter 139, section 25, is amended  
12 to read as follows:

13 SEC. 25. INTENT — REPORTS.

14 1. The department of corrections in cooperation with  
15 townships, the Iowa cemetery associations, and other nonprofit  
16 or governmental entities may use inmate labor during the  
17 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2014, to restore or preserve  
18 rural cemeteries and historical landmarks. The department in  
19 cooperation with the counties may also use inmate labor to  
20 clean up roads, major water sources, and other water sources  
21 around the state.

22 2. On a quarterly basis the department shall provide a  
23 status report regarding private-sector employment to the  
24 legislative services agency beginning on July 1, 2014. The  
25 report shall include the number of offenders employed in the  
26 private sector, the combined number of hours worked by the  
27 offenders, the total amount of allowances, and the distribution  
28 of allowances pursuant to section 904.702, including any moneys  
29 deposited in the general fund of the state.

30 Sec. 8. 2013 Iowa Acts, chapter 139, section 26, is amended  
31 to read as follows:

32 SEC. 26. ELECTRONIC MONITORING REPORT. The department of  
33 corrections shall submit a report on electronic monitoring to  
34 the general assembly, to the co-chairpersons and the ranking  
35 members of the joint appropriations subcommittee on the justice

1 system, and to the legislative services agency by January  
2 15, 2015. The report shall specifically address the number  
3 of persons being electronically monitored and break down the  
4 number of persons being electronically monitored by offense  
5 committed. The report shall also include a comparison of any  
6 data from the prior fiscal year with the current year.

7 Sec. 9. 2013 Iowa Acts, chapter 139, section 27, is amended  
8 to read as follows:

9 SEC. 27. STATE AGENCY PURCHASES FROM PRISON INDUSTRIES.

10 1. As used in this section, unless the context otherwise  
11 requires, "state agency" means the government of the state  
12 of Iowa, including but not limited to all executive branch  
13 departments, agencies, boards, bureaus, and commissions, the  
14 judicial branch, the general assembly and all legislative  
15 agencies, institutions within the purview of the state board of  
16 regents, and any corporation whose primary function is to act  
17 as an instrumentality of the state.

18 2. State agencies are hereby encouraged to purchase  
19 products from Iowa state industries, as defined in section  
20 904.802, when purchases are required and the products are  
21 available from Iowa state industries. State agencies shall  
22 obtain bids from Iowa state industries for purchases of  
23 office furniture during the fiscal year beginning July 1,  
24 2014, exceeding \$5,000 or in accordance with applicable  
25 administrative rules related to purchases for the agency.

26 Sec. 10. 2013 Iowa Acts, chapter 139, section 28, is amended  
27 to read as follows:

28 SEC. 28. IOWA LAW ENFORCEMENT ACADEMY.

29 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the  
30 state to the Iowa law enforcement academy for the fiscal year  
31 beginning July 1, 2014, and ending June 30, 2015, the following  
32 amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the  
33 purposes designated:

34 For salaries, support, maintenance, miscellaneous purposes,  
35 including jailer training and technical assistance, and for not

1 more than the following full-time equivalent positions:  
 2 ..... \$ 500,849  
 3 ..... FTEs 23.88

4 It is the intent of the general assembly that the Iowa law  
 5 enforcement academy may provide training of state and local  
 6 law enforcement personnel concerning the recognition of and  
 7 response to persons with Alzheimer's disease.

8 The Iowa law enforcement academy may temporarily exceed and  
 9 draw more than the amount appropriated in this subsection and  
 10 incur a negative cash balance as long as there are receivables  
 11 equal to or greater than the negative balance and the amount  
 12 appropriated in this subsection is not exceeded at the close  
 13 of the fiscal year.

14 2. The Iowa law enforcement academy may select at least  
 15 five automobiles of the department of public safety, division  
 16 of state patrol, prior to turning over the automobiles to  
 17 the department of administrative services to be disposed  
 18 of by public auction, and the Iowa law enforcement academy  
 19 may exchange any automobile owned by the academy for each  
 20 automobile selected if the selected automobile is used in  
 21 training law enforcement officers at the academy. However, any  
 22 automobile exchanged by the academy shall be substituted for  
 23 the selected vehicle of the department of public safety and  
 24 sold by public auction with the receipts being deposited in the  
 25 depreciation fund to the credit of the department of public  
 26 safety, division of state patrol.

29 SEC. 29. STATE PUBLIC DEFENDER. There is appropriated from  
 30 the general fund of the state to the office of the state public  
 31 defender of the department of inspections and appeals for the  
 32 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2014, and ending June 30, 2015,  
 33 the following amounts, or so much thereof as is necessary, to  
 34 be allocated as follows for the purposes designated:

10 to read as follows:

11 SEC. 30. BOARD OF PAROLE. There is appropriated from the  
12 general fund of the state to the board of parole for the fiscal  
13 year beginning July 1, 2014, and ending June 30, 2015, the  
14 following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be  
15 used for the purposes designated:

16 For salaries, support, maintenance, miscellaneous purposes,  
17 and for not more than the following full-time equivalent  
18 positions:

19 ..... \$ 601,918  
20 ..... FTEs 11.00

21 Sec. 13. 2013 Iowa Acts, chapter 139, section 31, is amended  
22 to read as follows:

23 SEC. 31. DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC DEFENSE. There is  
24 appropriated from the general fund of the state to the  
25 department of public defense for the fiscal year beginning July  
26 1, 2014, and ending June 30, 2015, the following amounts, or  
27 so much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes  
28 designated:

29 1. MILITARY DIVISION

30 For salaries, support, maintenance, miscellaneous purposes,  
31 and for not more than the following full-time equivalent  
32 positions:

33 ..... \$ 3,263,521  
34 ..... FTEs 293.61

35 The military division may temporarily exceed and draw more

1 than the amount appropriated in this subsection and incur a  
2 negative cash balance as long as there are receivables of  
3 federal funds equal to or greater than the negative balance and  
4 the amount appropriated in this subsection is not exceeded at  
5 the close of the fiscal year.

6 2. HOMELAND SECURITY AND EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT DIVISION OR  
7 SUCCESSOR AGENCY

13 a. The homeland security and emergency management division

25 security threats, and when monitoring such threats.

22 This bill relates to and makes appropriations to the justice  
23 system.

24 The bill makes appropriations from the general fund of  
25 the state for fiscal year 2014-2015 to the departments of  
26 justice, corrections, public defense, and public safety, and  
27 the Iowa law enforcement academy, office of the state public  
28 defender, board of parole, Iowa state civil rights commission,  
29 and the criminal and juvenile justice planning division of the  
30 department of human rights.

31 The bill appropriates moneys from the department of commerce  
32 revolving fund to the office of consumer advocate of the  
33 department of justice for fiscal year 2014-2015.

34 The bill also appropriates moneys from the gaming  
35 enforcement revolving fund to the department of public safety

1 for fiscal year 2014-2015.

2     The bill appropriates moneys from the wireless E911  
3 emergency communications fund to the homeland security and  
4 emergency management division of the department of public  
5 defense for fiscal year 2014-2015.

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
