Requiring record checks of persons being employed by a hospital, health care facility, or other care provider and providing penalties.

Relating to various provisions administered by the insurance division of the department of commerce concerning premium tax refunds, the interstate insurance compact, insurer insolvency proceedings, individual health insurance, the small employer carrier reinsurance program, the Iowa comprehensive health association, fire insurance policies, the Iowa insurance guaranty association, the FAIR plan, motor vehicle service contracts, investments by county and state mutual associations, reciprocal or interinsurance contract premium rates, unauthorized activity of insurance producers, and annuity contracts for cemetery and funeral merchandise and funeral services, and making fees and penalties applicable and providing effective and retroactive applicability dates.
