The Senate met in regular session at 8:32 a.m., President Kibbie presiding.

HOUSE MESSAGES RECEIVED AND CONSIDERED

MR. PRESIDENT: I am directed to inform your honorable body that the House has on March 8, 2006, **passed** the following bills in which the concurrence of the Senate is asked:

House File 2233, a bill for an act relating to the time limit on executions of judgments and orders for wage garnishments.

Read first time and referred to committee on **Judiciary**.

House File 2239, a bill for an act requiring the board of directors of a school district to adopt a parent and guardian involvement policy.

Read first time and referred to committee on **Education**.

House File 2330, a bill for an act relating to the allowed growth factor adjustment funding for county mental health, mental

retardation, and developmental disabilities services funds and including effective date and retroactive applicability provisions.

[House File 2396](#), a bill for an act relating to the Iowa early intervention block grant program by requiring school districts to report certain reading assessment results to parents and extending the program's repeal date.
