# ONE HUNDRED FIRST CALENDAR DAY SIXTIETH SESSION DAY

Senate Chamber Des Moines, Iowa, Wednesday, April 22, 2009

The Senate met in regular session at 8:49 a.m., President Kibbie presiding.

Prayer was offered by Reverend Tony Liston, pastor of the Adventure Christian Community Church in Davenport, Iowa. He was the guest of Senator Seng.

The Journal of Tuesday, April 21, 2009, was approved.

# CONSIDERATION OF RESOLUTION (Regular Calendar)

Senator Gronstal asked and received unanimous consent to take up for consideration Senate Resolution 24.

#### **Senate Resolution 24**

On motion of Senator Gronstal, <u>Senate Resolution 24</u>, a resolution to welcome the President of the United States to the State of Iowa as part of the 2009 celebration of Earth Day, was taken up for consideration.

Senator Gronstal moved the adoption of <u>Senate Resolution 24</u>, which motion prevailed by a voice vote.

On motion of Senator Gronstal, the Senate recessed at 9:00 a.m. until 2:30 p.m.
