# FIFTY-FIRST CALENDAR DAY THIRTIETH SESSION DAY

Senate Chamber Des Moines, Iowa, Tuesday, February 27, 2024

The Senate met in regular session at 9:00 a.m., President Sinclair presiding.

Prayer was offered by the Honorable Janice Weiner, member of the Senate from Johnson County.

The Journal of Monday, February 26, 2024, was approved.

### HOUSE MESSAGES RECEIVED AND CONSIDERED

The following messages were received from the Chief Clerk of the House:

MADAM PRESIDENT: I am directed to inform your honorable body that the House has on February 26, 2024, **passed** the following bills in which the concurrence of the House was asked:

Senate File 2096, a bill for an act repealing gender balance requirements for appointive bodies.

<u>Senate File 2161</u>, a bill for an act relating to false reports to or communications with public safety entities, and providing penalties.

Senate File 2204, a bill for an act relating to interests in agricultural land acquired or held by foreign businesses, foreign governments, or nonresident aliens, or by agents, trustees, or fiduciaries thereof, by providing for registration and reporting requirements, providing for enforcement, and providing penalties.

ALSO:: That the House has on February 26, 2024, **passed** the following bills in which the concurrence of the Senate is asked:

<u>House File 2239</u>, a bill for an act relating to the dissemination and exhibition of obscene material to minors, and providing penalties.

Read first time and referred to committee on **Judiciary**.

House File 2257, a bill for an act relating to meat and poultry inspection, by providing an exception for certain establishments engaged in the slaughter of poultry and the preparation of poultry products on a custom basis, and including implementation provisions.

Read first time and attached to **Senate File 2207**.

<u>House File 2366</u>, a bill for an act relating to probate law, including charitable organizations as named beneficiaries.

Read first time and referred to committee on Judiciary.

House File 2513, a bill for an act authorizing the Iowa sheep and wool promotion board to issue orders for the suspension and recommencement of the assessment imposed on wool, and including effective date provisions.

Read first time and referred to committee on Agriculture.

House File 2585, a bill for an act relating to health care facilities, including joint training sessions and review of certain citations for nursing facilities, and exceptions to on-site inspections of health care facilities following complaints.

Read first time and referred to committee on **Health and Human Services**.

The Senate stood at ease at 9:26 a.m. until the fall of the gavel for the purpose of party caucuses.
