The Senate met in regular session at 9:01 a.m., President Sinclair presiding.

Prayer was offered by the Honorable Janice Weiner, member of the Senate from Johnson County.

The Journal of Monday, March 4, 2024, was approved.

HOUSE MESSAGES RECEIVED AND CONSIDERED

The following messages were received from the Chief Clerk of the House:

MADAM PRESIDENT: I am directed to inform your honorable body that the House has on March 4, 2024, **passed** the following bills in which the concurrence of the Senate is asked:

<u>House File 2319</u>, a bill for an act prohibiting counties and cities from providing guaranteed income programs, and including effective date provisions.

Read first time and referred to committee on **State Government**.

<u>House File 2571</u>, a bill for an act relating to the ability of peace officers to file a petition for emergency protective orders on behalf of persons seeking relief from domestic abuse.

Read first time and referred to committee on Judiciary.

<u>House File 2576</u>, a bill for an act establishing a cause of action for murder in the first degree by causing the death of another by delivering, dispensing, or providing fentanyl or a fentanyl-related substance, and making penalties applicable.

Read first time and referred to committee on Judiciary.

<u>House File 2628</u>, a bill for an act expanding the sales and use tax exemption allowed for nonprofit blood centers.

Read first time and referred to committee on Ways and Means.

<u>House File 2631</u>, a bill for an act relating to the use of moneys appropriated to support therapeutic classrooms, and including effective date provisions.

Read first time and passed on file.

The Senate stood at ease at 9:08 a.m. until the fall of the gavel for the purpose of party caucuses.

HOUSE AMENDMENT CONSIDERED

Senate File 295

Senator Whitver called up for consideration <u>Senate File 295</u>, a bill for an act concerning the creation, administration, and termination of adult and minor guardianships and conservatorships, amended by the House in House amendment <u>S-5037</u>, filed March 4, 2024.

Senator Dawson moved that the Senate concur in the House amendment.

The motion prevailed by a voice vote and the Senate **concurred** in the House amendment.

Senator Dawson moved that the bill, as amended by the House and concurred in by the Senate, be read the last time now and placed upon its passage, which motion prevailed by voice vote, and the bill was read the last time.
