The Senate met in regular session at 9:02 a.m., President Sinclair presiding.

Prayer was offered by the Honorable Mark Costello, member of the Senate from Mills County.

The Journal of Monday, March 25, 2024, was approved.

HOUSE MESSAGES RECEIVED AND CONSIDERED

MADAM PRESIDENT: I am directed to inform your honorable body that the House has on March 25, 2024, **concurred** in the Senate amendment and **passed** the following bills in which the concurrence of the House was asked:

<u>House File 259</u>, a bill for an act relating to matters under the purview of the department of veterans affairs, including county commissions of veteran affairs and cemetery expenditures.

House File 2240, a bill for an act relating to harassment by the dissemination, publishing, distribution, or posting of a visual depiction showing another person in a state of full or partial nudity or engaged in a sex act that has been altered to falsely depict another person, and making penalties applicable.

ALSO: That the House has on March 25, 2024, **amended** the Senate amendment, **concurred** in the Senate amendment **as amended**, and **passed** the following bills in which the concurrence of the Senate is asked:

House File 131, a bill for an act relating to matters under the purview of the credit union division of the department of commerce. (S-5098)

House File 319, a bill for an act relating to physical examinations of personnel working in licensed or registered child care facilities. (S–5099)

House File 2635, a bill for an act relating to the sales tax exemption for the purchase of central office equipment or transmission equipment used by certain entities primarily in the furnishing of telecommunications services on a commercial basis.

Read first time and referred to committee on Ways and Means.

<u>House File 2658</u>, a bill for an act relating to state child care assistance program reimbursement rates and eligibility for the children of certain child care providers.

Read first time and referred to committee on **Appropriations**.

House File 2661, a bill for an act relating to public safety personnel by modifying the retirement benefits of sheriffs and deputy sheriffs, restricting bail for murder in the first degree or felonious assaults committed upon public safety personnel, and providing for a tax credit for moving expenses available against the individual income tax for new public safety personnel moving to the state, and including retroactive applicability provisions.

Read first time and referred to committee on Ways and Means.

<u>House File 2663</u>, a bill for an act relating to national training for personnel of county commissions of veteran affairs, and making appropriations.

Read first time and referred to committee on **Appropriations**.

The Senate stood at ease at 9:07 a.m. until the fall of the gavel for the purpose of party caucuses.

The Senate resumed session at 11:09 a.m., President Sinclair presiding.
