The Senate met in regular session at 1:03 p.m., President Sinclair presiding.

Prayer was offered by the Honorable Jason Schultz, member of the Senate from Crawford County.

The Journal of Thursday, April 11, 2024, was approved.

The Senate stood at ease at 1:06 p.m. until the fall of the gavel.

The Senate resumed session at 1:14 p.m., President Sinclair presiding.

CONSIDERATION OF RESOLUTION (Regular Calendar)

Senator Whitver asked and received unanimous consent to take up for consideration Senate Resolution 110.

Senate Resolution 110

On motion of Senator Kraayenbrink, <u>Senate Resolution 110</u>, a resolution recognizing and congratulating Iowa State University (ISU) wrestler David Carr for his storied collegiate wrestling career, with report of committee recommending passage, was taken up for consideration.
