The Senate met in regular session at 9:03 a.m., Senator Edler presiding.

Prayer was offered by the Honorable Tom Shipley, member of the Senate from Adams County.

Senate File 2370, a bill for an act concerning the executive branch rulemaking process and other agency functions and related matters. (S-5182)

ALSO: That the House has on April 17, 2024, **concurred** in the Senate amendment **and passed** the following bills in which the concurrence of the House was asked:

House File 255, a bill for an act modifying requirements related to teacher intern license programs and licenses and authorizations issued by the board of educational examiners and establishing a temporary initial teaching license to be issued by the board of educational examiners to applicants who complete an alternative teacher certification program.

House File 2545, a bill for an act requiring the director of the department of education to conduct a comprehensive review of the state's high school graduation requirements, core curriculum, core content standards, and educational standards and to recommend policy changes, and including effective date provisions.
