Re: Report of Personal Financial Disclosure Forms by Senate Candidates in SD35

Dear Senate Ethics Committee Members:

Pursuant to Iowa Code section 68B.35 and Senate Ethics Rule 11A, candidates for the Senate are required to file Personal Financial Disclosure Statements. Rule 11A also requires the Secretary of the Senate to inform the Ethics Committee with the results of these filings.

If the statement is not filed, the Secretary of the Senate is to issue notice that the individual has five days to file or be subject to a \$50 penalty and possible referral to the Committee.

1. A special election was set in Senate District 35. Both recognized political parties held conventions to nominate candidates for the January 28, 2025 election.
2. As of today's date, both candidates have filed the required forms and the forms have been posted on the General Assembly Web site.

As such, there has been full compliance and the Committee does not need to take any action on this matter.
