The Senate met in regular session at 9:01 a.m., President Sinclair presiding.

Prayer was offered by the Honorable Jeff Reichman, member of the Senate from Lee County.

The Journal of Wednesday, March 19, 2025, was approved.

BILL REFERRED TO COMMITTEE

President Sinclair announced that [Senate File 613](#) was referred from the Ways and Means Calendar to the committee on **Appropriations** under Senate Rule 38.

HOUSE MESSAGES RECEIVED AND CONSIDERED

The following messages were received from the Chief Clerk of the House:

MADAM PRESIDENT: I am directed to inform your honorable body that the House has on March 19, 2025, **passed** the following bills in which the concurrence of the House was asked:

[Senate File 266](#), a bill for an act relating to theft, forgery, and fraud involving a gift card, and providing penalties.

[Senate File 470](#), a bill for an act relating to prior authorization for dental care services, notice to dental care providers that a dental care service plan is state-regulated, and the recovery of overpayments by a dental carrier.

[Senate File 605](#), a bill for an act relating to state income tax withholdings on winnings from sports wagering, and including effective date provisions.

ALSO: That the House has on March 19, 2025, **passed** the following bills in which the concurrence of the Senate is asked:

[House File 189](#), a bill for an act relating to the eligibility of students enrolled in nonpublic schools to compete in extracurricular interscholastic athletic contests or competitions provided by public schools, and including effective date provisions.

Read first time and referred to committee on **Education**.

[House File 389](#), a bill for an act relating to student abuse by school employees.

Read first time and attached to [Senate File 517](#).

[House File 624](#), a bill for an act relating to the farm tenancy net income exclusion available against the individual income tax, and including effective date and retroactive applicability provisions.

Read first time and referred to committee on **Ways and Means**.

[House File 806](#), a bill for an act relating to peer review committees and organ procurement organizations.

Read first time and referred to committee on **Health and Human Services**.

[House File 848](#), a bill for an act relating to the state transportation commission, including by expanding the number of members and requiring certain members to represent and reside within specific regions of the state, and including effective date and applicability provisions.

Read first time and referred to committee on **Transportation**.

[House File 851](#), a bill for an act relating to student nutrition, including by modifying the curricula provided to students enrolled in kindergarten through grade twelve to include instruction related to nutrition, modifying provisions related to the agriculture, food, and natural resources component of the career and technical education instruction provided to students enrolled in grades nine through twelve, and modifying provisions related to school meal programs, and including effective date and applicability provisions.

[House File 857](#), a bill for an act relating to solicitation by a financial institution using prescreened trigger lead information from a consumer report.

Read first time and attached to [Senate File 587](#).

[House File 860](#), a bill for an act prohibiting state and local regulations on fuel-powered equipment based on the equipment's fuel source.

Read first time and referred to committee on **Commerce**.

[House File 869](#), a bill for an act providing for the conduct of licensed veterinarians when involved in certain legal matters involving the alleged mistreatment of animals, including by providing for immunity from administrative, civil, or criminal liability when acting in good faith; providing for administrative, civil, or criminal liability when not acting in good faith; and making penalties applicable.

Read first time and referred to committee on **Judiciary**.

[House File 875](#), a bill for an act relating to health insurers' credentialing process.

Read first time and referred to committee on **Commerce**.

[House File 879](#), a bill for an act relating to critical infrastructure sabotage, and making penalties applicable.

Read first time and attached to [Senate File 577](#).

[House File 886](#), a bill for an act relating to the improvement of United States highway 30, including prioritization by the state transportation commission and restrictions on associated use of eminent domain.

Read first time and referred to committee on **Transportation**.

[House File 894](#), a bill for an act relating to the release of liens on snowmobiles, all-terrain vehicles, and water vessels.

Read first time and referred to committee on **Local Government**.

[House File 895](#), a bill for an act relating to regional transit districts.

Read first time and referred to committee on **Transportation**.
