NATURAL RESOURCES AND ENVIRONMENT

Bill Title: [SENATE FILE 2255 \(SSB 3125\)](#), a bill for an act relating to the treatment of private sewage disposal systems, including monitoring, maintenance, and reporting requirements, and including applicability provisions.

Recommendation: APPROVED COMMITTEE BILL.
