POSTAGE.

JOINT RESOLUTION relative to postage.

Resolved, by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa,

Duty of treasurer—duty of secretary. That the treasurer of state be, and he is hereby instructed to make prompt payment of the postage on letters, newspapers and other public documents sent to and from members of the general assembly during the present session, and in the event of there being no money in the state treasury at the close of said session, it is hereby made the duty of the secretary of state to negotiate a loan for that purpose.

RESOLUTION—NO. 4.

MAIL ROUTE.

JOINT RESOLUTION for a mail route from Mt. Pleasant to Oskaloosa.

Resolved, by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa,

Mail from Mt. Pleasant to Oskaloosa. That our members in congress be requested to use their influence in procuring the establishment of a mail route from Mount Pleasant, in Henry county, via Brighton, in Washington county, Richland and Waugh's Point, in Keokuk county, to Oskaloosa, in Mahaska county.

[89] **Request to secretary.** *Resolved,* That the secretary of state be requested to forward a copy of the above resolution to our members in congress at as early a day as practicable.

RESOLUTION—NO. 5.

RAIL ROAD.

JOINT RESOLUTION for a grant of land from congress.

Resolved, by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa,

Grant of land to aid in constructing railroad from Davenport to Council Bluffs. That our senators when elected, be instructed, and representatives in congress be requested, to procure from the government of the United States, a grant of land to aid in the construction of a rail road from Davenport, by way of Iowa City, Monroe City, Raccoon Fork, to some point near Council Bluffs, on the Missouri river in this state.
