

ing Commissioners, created by Chapter 10 of the Acts of the Extra Session of the Eighth General Assembly of the State, and on the Auditing Commissioner by Chapter 111, Acts of the Tenth General Assembly of the State of Iowa; *Provided*, that the claims shall be presented and audited at the Auditor's office.

SEC. 2. The Auditor of State, under this Act, shall have no power to consider and act upon any military claims which have heretofore been passed upon and rejected by said Board of Auditing Commissioners, or by said Auditing Commissioner.

Claims, when presented.
Powers repealed.

SEC. 3. All Acts and parts of Acts inconsistent with this Act, are hereby repealed.

Acts repealed

SEC. 4. This Act being deemed of immediate importance by the General Assembly, shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the Iowa Homestead and Daily State Register, newspapers published at Des Moines, Iowa.

CHAPTER 15.

PRINTING GOVERNOR'S MESSAGE.

AN ACT to provide for the printing and distributing of the Governor's Biennial Message.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa*, That it shall be the duty of the Governor of the State of Iowa, to cause to be printed by the State Printer, five thousand copies, in the English language, of his Biennial Message, for distribution among the members of the General Assembly.

Governor's Message
printed in the English language.
For distribution in the Assembly.

SEC. 2. The printed copies above provided for shall be ready for distribution immediately after the delivery of the Governor's Biennial Message to the General Assembly.

When to be ready for distribution.

SEC. 3. The distribution to the two branches of the Legislature shall be in the following proportion, to-wit: to the Senate two thousand copies, and to the House of Representatives three thousand copies.

How many to each branch.
