

CHAPTER 103.

GREENE'S SUPREME COURT REPORTS.

AN ACT to Provide for the Purchase of G. Greene's Reports of the Decisions of the Supreme Court of Iowa. APRIL 12.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa*, That the Commissioners of the State Library be and they are hereby authorized and required to, at as early time as practicable, purchase, at an expense of not exceeding five dollars per copy, two hundred copies of each volume of G. Greene's reports of the decisions of the Supreme Court of Iowa. Commissioners of State library to purchase 200 copies of Greene's reports.

SEC. 2. On the certificate of the said Commissioners to the Auditor of State, of the purchase of said reports, and the deposit thereof in the State library, he shall draw his warrant upon the State Treasurer, payable to the order of the person of whom the purchase was made, for the purchase-money of said books, not exceeding the price above named, which shall be paid out of any money in the State treasury not otherwise appropriated. Auditor to draw warrant on certificate of com'rs.

SEC. 3. It shall be the duty of the said Commissioners to retain said reports in the State library for distribution and exchange, as now provided by law in relation to other Iowa reports. Reports to be retained in library for distribution, etc.

SEC. 4. This act being deemed of immediate importance shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the Iowa State Register, and Des Moines Bulletin, newspapers published at Des Moines, Iowa. Taking effect.

CHAPTER 104.

SETTLERS ON DES MOINES RIVER LANDS.

AN ACT for the Relief of certain Settlers upon the Des Moines River Lands. APRIL 13.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa*, That any person who shall have settled upon any of the odd sections of land along the
