SOLDIERS' ORPHANS' HOMES.

AN ACT Making Additional Appropriation for Iowa Soldiers' APRIL 17. Orphanis' Homes.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa, That there is hereby appropriated, Appropriation: out of any money in the State treasury not otherwise apfor Home at Da. propriated: - For Soldiers' Orphans' Home at Davenport: venport, \$6200; for improvement, hospital repairs and furniture, six thousand dollars; for library, two hundred dollars. For Solfor Home at Ce diers' Orphans' Home at Cedar Falls: for improvements dar Falls, \$2800; and repoirs two thousand dellars: for library for l and repairs, two thousand dollars; for library, three hunat dred dollars. For Soldiers' Orphans' Home at Glenwood: for Home at Glenwood \$6200. for improvements and repairs, wash-house, school-rooms, and school-room furniture, six thousand dollars; for li-

brary, two hundred dollars.

SEC. 2. The money shall be drawn from the State Money how treasury upon the Auditor's warrants, issued upon the drawo. order of the president of the Board of Trustees, only as it shall be needed.
