That our senators in congress be instructed, and our representatives requested, to use their influence to procure the establishment of a mail route from Sabula, in Jackson county, to Cascade, in Dubuque county, taking by the route the following towns and points, to-wit: by Van Buren, Amoy, Andrew, Hasan's Mill, Otter Creek, and Garry Owens, in Jackson county; by the house of Thos. McAnally, in Jones county, and thence to Cascade, in Dubuque county.

That the governor be requested to transmit a copy of the above resolution to each of our senators and representatives in congress.
