

## CHAPTER 77.

## INDEPENDENT DISTRICTS OF HAWKEYE, AND FARMERSBURG AND WAGNER, LEGALIZED.

H. F. 617. AN ACT to Legalize Certain Acts of the School Board of the Independent District of Hawkeye of Farmersburg, and of the Independent District of Farmersburg and Wagner in Clayton County, Iowa.

Preamble. WHEREAS, On the 24th day of March, 1882, the board of directors of the Independent School District of Hawkeye of Farmersburg, Clayton county, Iowa, set off to the Independent District of Farmersburg and Wagner, for school purposes, the northwest quarter of southwest quarter of section seventeen (17) township ninety-four (94) north of range four (4) west of the fifth principal meridian, and the board of directors of the Independent District of Farmersburg and Wagner at a called meeting on the 25th day of March 1882, accepted said tract of land and annexed said territory to said Independent District of Farmersburg and Wagner for school purposes; and,

WHEREAS, Doubts have since arisen as to the legality of the action of said boards of directors in so transferring said territory; therefore,

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:*

Legalized. SECTION 1. That the official acts of said boards of directors of the Independent Districts of Hawkeye of Farmersburg, and of Farmersburg and Wagner in the transfer of said territory from the Independent District of Hawkeye to the Independent District of *Farmburg* [Farmersburg] and Wagner for school purpose, are hereby legalized, and the same are made valid as though the law had in all respects been strictly complied with.

Publication. SEC. 2. This act being deemed of immediate importance shall be in force and take effect from and after its publication in the *Des Moines Leader* and the *North Iowa Times*, newspapers published at Des Moines and McGregor, Iowa, without expense to the State.
