Any number of people may associate themselves Any number and become incorporated for the transaction of any lawful bus- of persons may iness, including the establishment of ferries, the construction, incorporate. ownership, operation and maintainance [maintenance] of canals, railways, bridges or other works of internal improvement, and the purchase, ownership, operation and maintainance [maintenance] of any Railroad sold or transferred under power of sale or foreclosure of any mortgage deed or trust; but such incorporation confers no power or privelege not possessed by natural persons, except as hereinafter provided.

CHAPTER 87.

FIXING DUBATION OF CORPORATIONS OTHER THAN FOR PECUNIARY PROFIT.

AN ACT to Amend Section 1091 of the Code of 1878 Relating to Cor- H. F. 566. porations Other than Those for Pecuniary Profit.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

SECTION 1. That section 1091 of the code of 1873 be and the same is hereby amended by adding thereto the following words: "Corporations organized under this chapter shall endure for the corporations period of fifty years from and after their organization unless may endure sooner dissolved by a vote of three fourths of all the members thereof or by operation of law, and all corporations heretofore organized hereunder shall be extended for a like period unless sooner dissolved in like manner.
