CHAPTER 18.

S. F. 88. AN ACT to provide for the payment of the mileage of the committee appointed to visit the Institution for Feeble Minded at Glenwood.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:*

SECTION 1. That there be and hereby is appropriated out of any money in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated the sum of sixty-three dollars (\$63) for mileage of the joint committee appointed to visit the Institution for Feeble Minded at Glenwood, as follows:

B. F. Carroll .....	\$21
A. L. Wood .....	\$21
G. F. Baker .....	\$21

SEC. 2. This act being deemed of immediate importance shall take effect and be in force from and after the date of its publication in the Iowa State Register and Des Moines Leader, newspapers published in Des Moines, Iowa.

CHAPTER 19.

S. F. 87: AN ACT to repeal chapter 63 of the laws of the Twenty-third General Assembly, and enact a substitute therefor and providing for the appropriation of money to aid in procuring a library for the penitentiary at Anamosa.

Preamble. WHEREAS, There was appropriated by chapter 63 of the acts of the Twenty-third General Assembly the sum of \$1,000.00 to be used to help discharged convicts to an honest life, the same to be drawn from the treasury on the order of the Iowa Prisoners' Aid Association, approved by Executive Council, and

WHEREAS, The said Iowa Prisoners' Aid Association has ceased to exist, and a portion of said money has not been drawn from the treasury or used by said association, and

WHEREAS, The library of the State Penitentiary at Anamosa has recently been destroyed by fire together with the building in which the same was kept, and
