GENERAL LAWS.

CHAPTER 1.

S. F. 197.

AN ACT to amend an act passed by the extra session of the 26th G. A. of Iowa, entitled, "An act to provide for the annotation, indexing, publication, distribution and sale of the code and statutes hereafter enacted." [Amendatory of chapter 20, acts of 26th G. A., extra session.]

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

SECTION 1. Publication of parts of code. That an act passed by the extra session of the 26th general assembly of Iowa, entitled, "An act to provide for the annotation, indexing, publication, distribution and sale of the code and statutes hereafter enacted," the same being published in the code under the title, "Provisions relating to the code and subsequent statutes" on pages one (1) to five (5) inclusive, be amended by adding to section twenty-seven (27) the following: "But this section shall not prohibit the publication by the several state officers and commissions in their annual or biennial reports of extracts from the laws pertaining to their respective departments. Such extracts may be published in pamphlet form by such officers or commissions with the consent of the executive council, and the same shall be paid for out of the funds appropriated for the office or commission publishing the same. The executive council may also authorize the publication by private individuals of short extracts from the laws upon legal blanks."

CHAPTER 2.

S. F. 148.

AN ACT to repeal section forty-one (41) of the code, and enact a substitute therefor relating to the amendment and repeal of acts of the General Assembly.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

SECTION 1. Amendments—repeals—references. That section forty-one (41) of the code, be and the same is hereby repealed, and the following enacted in lieu thereof:
