CHAPTER 300.

BOARD OF CONTROL OF STATE INSTITUTIONS.

S. F. 514.

AN ACT to repeal section twenty-seven hundred twenty-seven-a44 (2727-a44), supplement to the code, 1913, and to enact a substitute therefor, relating to contingent funds at state institutions under the board of control.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

- SECTION 1. Contingent fund. That the law as it appears in
- section twenty-seven hundred twenty-seven-a44 (2727-a44), supple-
- ment to the code, 1913, be and the same is hereby repealed and the following enacted in lieu thereof: "The board of control may permit
- such contingent funds as in its judgment are deemed necessary, to remain in the hands of the managing officer of each institution, from
- which expenditures may be made for the payment of freight, postage,
- purchasing produce and other commodities requiring a cash settle-
- ment, discounting bills, and paying salaries to employes of the insti-10
- tution whose services terminate during the month. A full, minute and itemized statement of every expenditure made during the month 11
- from such funds shall be submitted by the proper officer of said in-stitution to the board under such rules and regulations as may be by 12

- said board prescribed. If necessary, the board shall make proper requisition upon the auditor of state for a warrant on the state treas-14 15
- 16 urer to secure the said contingent funds for each institution.'
