GENERAL LAWS

CHAPTER 1

GENERAL ASSEMBLY. EXPENSES OF MEMBERS

AN ACT to amend the law as it appears in section fourteen (14) of the code, 1927, so
as to provide for the payment of the expenses of members of the general assembly.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

1 SECTION 1. Each member of the general assembly and the lieutenant
2 ant governor shall be paid his actual necessary expenses incurred
3 while in attendance at a session of the legislature, which shall in no
4 case exceed five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for any regular session.
5 Sworn itemized claims therefor shall be filed with the state board of
6 audit and the provisions of chapter twenty-five (25) of the code shall
7 be applicable thereto. The members of the forty-third general assembly,
8 including the lieutenant governor, shall be entitled to the benefits
9 thereof.

1 SEC. 2. This act being deemed of immediate importance shall be in
2 full force and effect from and after its passage and publication in the
3 Jackson Sentinel, a newspaper published at Maquoketa, Iowa, and
4 the Telegraph Herald and Times Journal, a newspaper published at
5 Dubuque, Iowa.
