CHAPTER 312

PAYMENT FOR ANIMALS SLAUGHTERED

AN ACT to make an appropriation to compensate William Sexton, Stewart Baker, William Lynch, William Brown, and William Drew, for horses slaughtered under the authority and direction of the secretary of agriculture because of glanders infection.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

1 SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to the following persons
 2 the following amounts as set opposite their names for horses
 3 slaughtered under authority and direction of the secretary of agri-
 4 culture because of glanders infection:

- 5 William Sexton—two hundred seventy-five dollars (\$275.00)
- 6 Stewart Baker—two hundred dollars (\$200.00)
- 7 William Lynch—three hundred seventy-five dollars (\$375.00)
- 8 William Brown—one hundred twenty-five dollars (\$125.00)
- 9 William Drew—one hundred twenty-five dollars (\$125.00)

10 and the auditor of state is hereby authorized to draw his warrant for
 11 said amounts to said parties, and the treasurer of state is hereby
 12 authorized and directed to pay the same out of the funds appropriated
 13 to the department of agriculture for the division of animal industry
 14 for the eradication of contagious and infectious diseases among the
 15 livestock of the state of Iowa.

1 SEC. 2. The receipt of the said sums by the said parties shall be
 2 in full settlement of any claims against the state of Iowa by said
 3 claimants.

1 SEC. 3. This act being deemed of immediate importance shall be
 2 in full force and effect from and after its publication in Newton Daily
 3 News, a newspaper published in Newton, Iowa, and in Grinnell Herald,
 4 a newspaper published in Grinnell, Iowa, without expense to the state.
