

CHAPTER 148

MRS. OSCAR BARNES, ET AL.

H. F. 501

AN ACT to make appropriations to Mrs. Oscar Barnes, O. D. Albrecht, O. Evald Olson, Adolph Wiese, Martin Borlaug, J. C. Robinson, Henry G. Peterson, Everett Harris, Gordon L. Elliott, and W. C. Johnson.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

1 SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated out of the state fair board
2 fund (188-15, 45th) to Mrs. Oscar Barnes of Des Moines, Iowa, the
3 sum of one hundred (100) dollars in settlement of her claim for dam-
4 ages on account of injury sustained by her in the stock pavilion on the
5 Iowa state fair grounds, Monday, August 27, 1934, when other spec-
6 tators became frightened and injured her as they attempted to get out
7 of said building.

1 SEC. 2. There is hereby appropriated out of any money in the state
2 treasury not otherwise appropriated (10-31, 45 Extra) to O. D. Al-
3 brecht the sum of thirty-five (35) dollars to compensate him for use of
4 motorcycle and side car April 28 to May 6, 1933, to precede troops to
5 LeMars, and to O. Evald Olson the sum of fifteen (15) dollars for medi-
6 cal services rendered Private James Wolfe and Private Kenneth A.
7 Erwin in May and June, 1933, while they were in line of military duty.

1 SEC. 3. There is hereby appropriated out of any money in the state
2 treasury not otherwise appropriated to Adolph Wiese the sum of three
3 hundred (300) dollars in full settlement of all claims held by him
4 against the state of Iowa on any account whatsoever and more particu-
5 larly his claim for damages sustained while he was an inmate of the
6 state penitentiary at Fort Madison, Iowa, the injury being inflicted by
7 a saw which lacked proper guards.

1 SEC. 4. There is hereby appropriated out of any money in the state
2 treasury not otherwise appropriated to Martin Borlaug the sum of five
3 hundred (500) dollars in full settlement of his claim for damages on
4 account of the collapse of a bridge across Turkey river on the public
5 highway about three (3) miles south of Cresco, Iowa.

1 SEC. 5. There is hereby appropriated out of any money in the state
2 treasury not otherwise appropriated to J. C. Robinson of Shelby
3 county, Iowa, the sum of nine hundred seventy-five (975) dollars in full
4 settlement of all claims held by him for damages on account of injuries
5 sustained by him, damage to his automobile, and expense incurred as
6 a result of a collision of his Chrysler coach with Iowa official car No. 37
7 on highway No. 7 in Pottawattamie county, said state car being at that
8 time operated by an employee of the state board of assessment and
9 review.

1 SEC. 6. There is hereby appropriated out of any money in the state
2 treasury not otherwise appropriated the sum of one hundred (100) dol-
3 lars to Henry G. Peterson of Des Moines, Iowa, in full settlement of all
4 claims held by him against the state of Iowa on account of injuries
5 sustained on December 1, 1933, while he was doing carpenter work on
6 the state-house grounds, he having been injured while operating an

7 obsolete planer with an oblong head, which planer was unsafe for use
8 and due to its defective condition cut off a portion of the index finger
9 on the right hand and caused some injury to another finger.

1 SEC. 7. There is hereby appropriated out of any money in the state
2 treasury not otherwise appropriated to Everett Harris the sum of five
3 hundred (500) dollars in full settlement of any and all claims for dam-
4 ages held by him against the state of Iowa on account of injuries sus-
5 tained while he was an inmate of the state reformatory at Anamosa on
6 or about April 5, 1932, said injury being an axe wound on the foot of
7 the claimant, which, on account of not having had proper medical
8 treatment, has caused claimant great pain and suffering and more or
9 less permanent injury.

1 SEC. 8. There is hereby appropriated out of any money in the state
2 treasury not otherwise appropriated the sum of thirty (30) dollars to
3 Gordon L. Elliott of Des Moines, Iowa, in full settlement of his claim
4 against the state for reporting joint hearing of senate and house com-
5 mittees on insurance in investigation of the insurance department, as
6 authorized by House J. R. No. 6, and for two copies of transcript of
7 proceedings of said hearings, said claim being for the total sum of
8 fifty-nine (59) dollars.

1 SEC. 9. There is hereby appropriated out of any funds in the state
2 treasury heretofore appropriated to the department of the bureau of
3 labor to W. C. Johnson of Waterloo, Iowa, the sum of twenty-six (26)
4 dollars in full settlement of all claims held by him and growing out of
5 damage to his Whippet automobile as a result of a collision with a bu-
6 reau of labor automobile on or about February 27, 1935, in Waterloo,
7 Iowa.

1 SEC. 10. The state comptroller is hereby directed to issue his war-
2 rants to the several parties named in this act for the amounts herein
3 appropriated to them, said warrants to be drawn on the funds specified
4 by this act, and the treasurer of state is hereby authorized to pay said
5 warrants and charge the same to the funds specified by said warrants
6 and by this act.

1 SEC. 11. Receipt by the parties herein named of said sums appro-
2 priated by this act to them shall be in full settlement of any and all
3 claims held by them against the state of Iowa growing out of the mat-
4 ters referred to in this act and on any and all accounts whatsoever.
