

CHAPTER 21

APPROPRIATION FOR PURCHASE OF THE KASSON

MEMORIAL BUILDING

S. F. 236

AN ACT to provide for the better preservation and usefulness of the archives of the state.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

1 SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated out of any funds not
2 otherwise appropriated the sum of nine thousand five hundred twenty
3 dollars and eighty-eight cents (\$9520.88) for the purpose of purchase
4 of the Kasson Memorial building, in accordance with an option thereon
5 secured by the Retrenchment and Reform committee of the Forty-
6 ninth General Assembly, in connection with a lease of the property as
7 a part of the State Department of History and Archives, and the
8 purchase of the ground on which said building is located, the title to
9 said real estate and building to be placed in the State of Iowa.

1 SEC. 2. There is also appropriated the sum of three thousand four
2 hundred dollars (\$3400.00) for the purpose of erecting a floor on the
3 gallery level of said building, and construction of a freight elevator
4 and other similar improvements, same to be done in accordance with
5 plans approved by the Trustees and the curator of the State Depart-
6 ment of History and Archives under supervision of the state architect.

1 SEC. 3. This act shall become a law and be of effect upon its
2 publication in the Cedar Falls Daily Record, a newspaper published at
3 Cedar Falls, Iowa, and in the Creston News-Advertiser, a newspaper
4 published at Creston, Iowa.

CHAPTER 22

SUPREME COURT

H. F. 465

AN ACT to provide an emergency appropriation to cover remaining expenses incurred by the advisory committee of the supreme court on rules of procedure.

WHEREAS, the 49th General Assembly passed an act authorizing the Supreme Court to formulate and prescribe rules of civil proceedings for all courts of this state; and

WHEREAS, the Supreme Court with the aid of an Advisory Committee, entered upon the task of promulgating said rules; and

WHEREAS, the General Assembly failed to grant an appropriation for this work, and because of such failure, the Supreme Court has been obliged to rely upon an emergency grant by the committee on retrenchment and reform for such work; and
