report will be filed by the first day of the 51st General Assembly, and 37 to take such steps and put into effect such measures, not prohibited 38 39 by law, as may facilitate the purposes of this resolution. The said commission will meet not oftener than once every 1 SEC. 3. 2 three months, except oftener upon the recommendation of the 3 Governor, in the City of Des Moines, at a place to be arranged in 4 advance by the Executive Council. 1 SEC. 4. The Governor shall have the power to fill any vacancies. 1 SEC. 5. All state and local public officers and employees shall co-operate with this commission by supplying it with such data and 2 3 facts which the commission may deem necessary in its deliberation 4 from time to time. 1 The members of the commission shall receive no compensa-SEC. 6. 2 tion for their services, except their actual and necessary expenses 3 to be audited by the comptroller of the State and paid from the general 4 fund of the State. The Executive Council shall provide necessary clerical 1 SEC. 7. help and office supplies and provide for publishing reports by such 2 3 commission, which expenditures are to be certified by the chairman and audited by the comptroller of the state and paid from the general 4 5 fund of the state.

CHAPTER 313

CONTINUING ACCOUNTING PROCEDURE APPROPRIATION

S. J. R. 9

A JOINT RESOLUTION to provide that the unexpended balance remaining in the fund appropriated to the executive council, by section eighteen (18) of chapter one (1), acts of the Forty-ninth (49th) General Assembly, for the purpose of revising the accounting and accounting procedure of the state including the payment of consultants, shall not revert to the general fund at the expiration of the current biennial fiscal term but shall continue to be available for the purposes enumerated in said act and for additional purposes.

WHEREAS, there has been appropriated to the executive council of the state by section eighteen (18) of chapter one (1), Acts of the Forty-ninth (49th) General Assembly, the sum of three thousand dollars for each year of the biennium beginning July 1, 1941, and ending June 30, 1943, for the purpose of revising the accounting and accounting procedure of the state including the payment of consultants, and

WHEREAS, the executive council has diligently employed said fund for the purposes enumerated in said act. but has not and will not be able to complete its work by June 30, 1943, and,

WHEREAS, there is urgent need to continue the work of revising the accounting system of the state, and,

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WHEREAS, the balance unexpended from the total amount of six thousand dollars appropriated by said act is sufficient to continue the work of the executive council if said balance does not revert to the general fund on July 1, 1943, and

WHEREAS, all unexpended balances from appropriations made in the biennial appropriation act automatically revert to the general fund at the end of the biennium for which they were appropriated unless the general assembly shall manifest a contrary intention as to any particular fund by appropriate action; now therefore,

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

1 SECTION 1. The unexpended balance remaining on June 30, 1943, $\overline{\mathbf{2}}$ in the fund appropriated by section eighteen (18) of chapter one (1), Acts of the Forty-ninth (49th) General Assembly, in the total amount 3 4 of six thousand dollars for the purpose of revising the accounting and 5 accounting procedure of the state including the payment of consultants 6 shall not revert to the general fund of the state on July 1, 1943, but shall continue to be available from and after that date by the executive 7 council for the purposes enumerated in said act and for the additional 8 9 purpose of purchasing an accounting machine for use in the state 10 comptroller's office.

1 SEC. 2. This act, being deemed of immediate importance, shall be 2 in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication in 3 the Community Press, a newspaper published at Maquoketa, Iowa, 4 and the Jefferson Bee, a newspaper published at Jefferson, Iowa.

CHAPTER 314

COMMISSION TO STUDY SCHOOL LAW CODIFICATION

A JOINT RESOLUTION for the appointment of commission to make further study of the matter provided for in chapter one hundred fifty-two (152) (S. F. 291) acts of the 49th General Assembly, providing the scope of the work of the commission, and providing for a report of the commission to the Governor and making an appropria-tion to carry out the provisions of the resolution.

WHEREAS, House File 300, a bill prepared and sponsored by the commission for recodification and recommendation of school laws as defined and set out in Chapter 152 laws of the 49th General Assembly, was not filed as provided in said Chapter 152 and in fact the report of said commission as proposed by House File 300 was not filed until February 12, 1943, over one month after the convening of the 50th General Assembly, and

WHEREAS, said bill when filed contained 437 pages and attempted to establish far reaching changes in our school system and its laws, and
