CHAPTER 140

STOCKYARDS' WASTE MATERIALS

S. F. 490

AN ACT relating to the boiling of waste materials from stockyards.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

- SECTION 1. Section one hundred sixty-three point twenty-six (163.26), subsection three (3), Code 1958, is hereby amended by striking in line six (6) the word "stockyards,".
- SEC. 2. Section one hundred sixty-three point twenty-six (163.26), subsection three (3), Code 1958, is hereby further amended by striking the period at the end of line nine (9) and inserting the following: ", except grain not consumed, that is collected from hog sales pen floors in public stockyards and fed under the control of the department of agriculture."
- SEC. 3. This Act, being deemed of immediate importance, shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication in the Sioux City Journal, a newspaper published at Sioux City, Iowa, and in the Sioux Center News, a newspaper published at Sioux Center, Iowa.

CHAPTER 141

IMPORTATION OF SWINE

H. F. 318

AN ACT to regulate and control importation of swine into Iowa.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

- SECTION 1. After July 1, 1959, no swine other than purebred shall be imported into Iowa for feeding or breeding purposes without first having affixed in either ear of each animal a numbered tag and ac-3 companied by a health certificate issued by a qualified veterinarian. 4 A copy of the health certificate shall be promptly forwarded to the animal industry division of the Iowa department of agriculture. Such certificate shall include a statement showing that the swine have been inspected within ninety-six hours prior to the time of importation and that there are no symptoms of any infectious, contagious or com-municable disease, and a statement that the swine have been vac-10 cinated against hog cholera by the method described by statute, not 11 less than ten (10) days prior to the date of entry into Iowa, unless a 12 permit allowing importation subject to immunization upon arrival 13
- 14 has been obtained. The health certificate shall further include the ear
