

## CHAPTER 20.

## STATE ROAD.

AN ACT to locate a state road from Clayton City, in Clayton county, to the Des Moines river, in Kossuth county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa*, That Isaac Templeton and Charles Hoyt, of Fayette county, and O. W. Crary of Clayton county, be, and the same are hereby appointed commissioners to lay out and establish a state road leading from Clayton City in Clayton county, on the nearest and best way to Garnavillo, thence to Elkader in said county, thence to Lima, Fayette and Westfield, in Fayette county, thence via Wilson's Grove, and near the center of Bremer county, to Clarksville, in Butler county, thence to the north side of Thorp's Grove, near I. D. Leland's, in Franklin county, thence to a point on the Des Moines river, near the present residence of Dr. Williams, due West.

Names of Commissioners. Where from. Via. Where to. Comr's meet. SEC. 2. That the commissioners, or a majority of them, shall meet at Clayton City, on the first Tuesday in May, 1857, or within three months thereafter, and proceed to locate and establish said road according to law.

Surveyor, &c. SEC. 3. That said commissioners shall take to their assistance a competent surveyor and other necessary hands, who, together with the commissioners, having been duly sworn, shall proceed to locate said road.

Per diem. Proviso. SEC. 4. That said commissioners shall have two dollars per day, and the chainmen and markers one dollar and fifty cents per day: *Provided*, that in case any of the commissioners should act as surveyor in laying out said road, they shall be entitled to receive for their services three dollars per day, and nothing more.

Expense, how paid. SEC. 5. That the expense of locating said road shall be paid out of the treasuries of the counties in which said road shall be located, in proportion to the time required in each for said location.

SEC. 6. This act to be in force from and after its passage.
