

LAWS OF IOWA.

District judges SEC. 2. That the several district judges of the state shall receive for their services the sum of \$1,200 per annum each, to be audited and paid in like manner as provided in the preceding section.

Commence. SEC. 3. That the salaries provided for in section 1, of this act, shall be audited as though they commenced running on the 6th day of August, A. D. 1856.

SEC. 4. To be in force from and after its publication in the Iowa City Republican and Iowa Capital Reporter.

CHAPTER 49.

BEDFORD.

AN ACT to legalize the re-survey of the town of Bedford, in Taylor county, Iowa, and better establish corners of the lots in said town.

Legalized. SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa*, That the survey and plat of the town of Bedford, the county seat of Taylor county, in the State of Iowa, situated upon section number twenty-six, in township No. sixty eight, north of range No. thirty-four west, made by Thomas F. Kimball, deputy county surveyor of said county, in the month of June, A. D. 1856, and recorded in the recorder's office in said county, shall be and remain the legal survey and plat of said town.

Co. surveyor. SEC. 2. That the county surveyor of the said county of Taylor is hereby required, upon being requested so to do by the county judge of said county, to remove the stones placed at the corners of the lots in the original survey, wherever the same do not agree to the corners of the lots as made by the survey and plat described in the first section of this act.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication according to law.
