

CHAPTER 45

MOTOR VEHICLE PLATES

S. F. 669

AN ACT to make transfer of certain fees, taxes, interest and penalties to the division of motor vehicle registration of the department of public safety for the purpose of purchasing supplies and materials, and for the cost of manufacturing motor vehicle registration plates at the prison industries.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

1 SECTION 1. On July 1, 1969, the treasurer of state shall, in addition to
2 the amounts provided for in section four hundred twenty-two point sixty-
3 two (422.62) of the Code, transfer from the net receipts collected under di-
4 vision four (IV) of chapter four hundred twenty-two (422) of the Code,
5 seven hundred eighty thousand (780,000) dollars to the division of motor
6 vehicle registration of the department of public safety for the purpose of
7 purchasing supplies and materials and for the cost of manufacturing motor
8 vehicle registration plates at the prison industries. Any amount unexpended
9 for this purpose on October 31, 1969, shall be credited to the road use tax
10 fund.

CHAPTER 46

PUBLIC SAFETY DEPARTMENT

S. F. 650

AN ACT to appropriate from the general fund of the state to the department of public safety and various divisions thereof.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

1 SECTION 1. For the department of public safety there is hereby appropri-
2 ated from the general fund of the state for each year of the biennium be-
3 ginning July 1, 1969 and ending June 30, 1971, the following amounts, or
4 so much thereof as may be necessary, to be used in the manner designated:

13 2. DIVISION OF CRIMINAL INVESTIGATION
14 For salaries and for the state's contribution
15 to the peace officers' retirement, accident, and
16 disability system provided in chapter ninety-
17 seven A (97A) of the Code, in the amount of
18 sixteen percent of the salaries of personnel in-
19 cluded in the system.

20	The salary of the director shall be thirteen	
21	thousand two hundred fifty dollars for the first	
22	year of the biennium, and fourteen thousand	
23	forty-five dollars for the second year of the bi-	
24	ennium, plus longevity. The current salary ranges	
25	of the other peace-officer classifications of the	
26	division, as defined in section ninety-seven A	
27	point one (97A.1) of the Code, shall be increased	
28	by six percent (6%) each year of the biennium,	
29	plus longevity.	
30	Longevity shall be the same as provided in	
31	section eighty point eight (80.8) of the Code for	
32	members of the highway patrol.	
33	Other salaries of the division shall be as pro-	
34	vided in the pay plan as approved by the execu-

51	teen percent of the salaries of personnel included	
52	in the system. The salary for the chief shall be	
53	fourteen thousand eight hundred forty dollars	
54	for the first year of the biennium and fifteen	
55	thousand seven hundred thirty dollars for the	
56	second year of the biennium, plus longevity. The	
57	current salary ranges of the other classifications	
58	in the highway patrol shall be increased by six	
59	percent (6%) each year of the biennium, plus	
60	longevity.	
61	Longevity shall be as provided in section	
62	eighty point eight (80.8) of the Code.	
63	Other salaries of the division shall be as pro-	
64	vided in the pay plan as approved by the execu-

1 SEC. 2. All federal grants to and the federal receipts of this department
2 and divisions thereof are hereby appropriated for the purpose set forth in
3 such federal grants or receipts.

1 SEC. 3. No moneys appropriated by this Act shall be used for capital
2 improvements.

1 SEC. 4. Where any of the laws of this state are in conflict with this
2 Act, the provisions of this Act shall govern for the biennium.

CHAPTER 47

RECIPROCITY BOARD

AN ACT to appropriate from the general fund of the state to the Iowa reciprocity board.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

1 SECTION 1. For the Iowa reciprocity board there is hereby appropriated
2 from the general fund of the state for each year of the biennium beginning
3 July 1, 1969 and ending June 30, 1971 the sum of one hundred thirty thou-
4 sand forty-four (130,044) dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary,
5 to be used in the following manner:
