CHAPTER 48

BOARD OF REGENTS INSTITUTIONS

S. F. 655

AN ACT to appropriate funds from the general fund of the state to the board of regents and institutions under the control of said board.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

1 SECTION 1. For the board of regents and institutions under said board
2 there is hereby appropriated from the general fund of the state for each
3 year of the biennium beginning July 1, 1969 and ending June 30, 1971, the
4 following amounts, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to be used for
5 the purposes and in the manner designated:

6 1. OFFICE OF BOARD OF REGENTS
7 For salaries, support, maintenance, equipment and miscel-
8 laneous purposes, including board members receiving a per
9 diem of thirty dollars per day \$ 110,500.00

10 2. BOARD OF REGENTS INSTITUTIONS
11 **State University of Iowa**

12 GENERAL UNIVERSITY, including lakeside laboratory.
13 For salaries, support, maintenance, equipment and miscel-
14 laneous purposes; and repairs, replacements and altera-
15 tions \$ 32,537,000.00

16 A portion of this appropriation shall be used for the training of general
17 practitioners in medicine and necessary staff for training additional medi-
18 cal practitioners shall be provided. Existing medical facilities in Polk Coun-
19 ty or elsewhere in the state may be used for such training. Students at-
20 tending the University of Iowa, Iowa City may be assigned to these facil-
21 ities for these purposes and in such manner as shall be specified by the
22 vice president for health affairs, the University of Iowa, Iowa City, or his
23 designee. The Board of Regents and the vice president for health affairs,
24 the University of Iowa, Iowa City, shall study the use of existing medical
25 facilities in Polk County and elsewhere in the state for the training of stu-
26 dents as general medical practitioners and shall report their comprehensive
27 findings to the higher education committees of the House and Senate of
28 the Sixty-third General Assembly not later than January 15, 1970.

1 SEC. 2. The board of regents or any institution under its control, or
 2 the governor and state comptroller, are authorized to obtain federal grants
 3 to be expended in connection with the operation of board of regents insti-
 4 tutions. All federal grants to and the federal receipts of the board of re-
 5 gents are hereby appropriated for the purpose set forth in such federal
 6 grants and receipts.

1 SEC. 3. No moneys appropriated under this Act or receipts, which may
 2 be used for the same purposes as said appropriations, may be used for cap-
 3 ital improvements.

1 SEC. 4. The provisions of chapter eight (8) of the Code shall apply to
 2 this Act.

1 SEC. 5. There shall be budget analysts attached to each of the three
 2 universities by the state comptroller. The purpose of the budget analysts
 3 shall be to provide liaison between the regent's institutions and the comp-
 4 troller's office in preparation and execution of the budgets and to research
 5 and accumulate financial and statistical data relative to the budgets. The
 6 budget analysts shall work closely with the financial and administrative
 7 officers of the institutions and the central office of the board of regents.

8 All financial and statistical data and information prepared or accumulat-
 9 ed by the budget analysts shall be made available to the governor and the
 10 general assembly for their needs in budgeting and appropriation legislation.

11 The budget analysts shall be provided with adequate office space, equip-
 12 ment and supplies by the institutions. Salary and travel expenses shall be
 13 paid by the state comptroller's office.

1 SEC. 6. Total expenditures of each institution under the state board
 2 of regents, including expenditures from state appropriations and from such
 3 other receipts as may be available for the same purposes as the state appro-
 4 priations during the biennium, shall not exceed the limitation as hereinaf-
 5 ter set forth, except as provided. The state board of regents may, in the
 6 event of an emergency or necessity arising at any particular institution
 7 under its control, expend more than the amount budgeted for such institu-
 8 tion providing that the expenditure shall be made out of increased re-
 9 cepts, such increased receipts meaning receipts in excess of the estimation
 10 of receipts of the respective institutions set forth in the appropriation pro-
 11 posals submitted to the governor and general assembly; and provided that
 12 thirty days prior to such proposed expenditure the board shall report in
 13 writing to the state comptroller and governor the specific purpose and
 14 need for such additional expenditure, and the source and amount of funds
 15 available therefor. The board shall set out in its biennial report to the gov-
 16 ernor and the general assembly all such increased expenditures, the pur-
 17 pose and need thereof, and the source and amount of funds used therefor.

18 This section is not intended to abridge the authority of the governor
 19 and state comptroller to make transfers under authority of section eight
 20 point thirty-nine (8.39) of the Code.

1 SEC. 7. Where any of the laws of this state are in conflict with this
2 Act, the provisions of this Act shall govern for the biennium.

1 SEC. 8. No part of the funds appropriated under this Act shall be used
2 to provide payments, assistance, or education, in any form, with respect to
3 any individual who is, while enrolled as a student or while teaching at a
4 university, convicted in any federal, state, or local court of competent
5 jurisdiction of inciting, promoting, or carrying on a riot, resulting in materi-
6 al damage to public property or injury to persons, unless such individual,
7 if a student, shall be reexamined by an admissions officer and be found by
8 him to be of proper character for readmission as a student.

CHAPTER 49

BOARD OF REGENTS CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS

S. F. 689

AN ACT to appropriate from the general fund of the state for capital improvements and purchases of land for institutions under the board of regents including construction of new buildings, repairs, improvements, land purchases, replacements, or alterations, and providing for joint control for the expenditure thereof by the board of regents, the governor, and the state comptroller.

Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:

1 SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated from the general fund of the
2 state for the biennium beginning July 1, 1969 and ending June 30, 1971,
3 to the board of regents the sum of seven million one hundred thousand
4 (7,100,000) dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to be used
5 to supplement any prior appropriations for capital improvement items for
6 construction of new buildings, repairs, improvements, purchases of land,
7 replacements, or alterations, or for any other capital expenditures the board
8 of regents may deem necessary for the proper and necessary function of
9 any institution under its jurisdiction and for the purchase of land for a
10 western Iowa regents institution.

1 SEC. 2. Contracts for improvements for which funds are appropriated
2 by this Act shall be submitted by the board of regents to the governor and
3 the state comptroller, except that items commonly known as change orders
4 need not be submitted to the governor and the state comptroller unless
5 such change orders actually increase the total cost of that particular
6 project.
