

11 If any surplus accrues to said revolving fund in excess of the original  
 12 appropriation for which there is no anticipated need or use, the governor  
 13 shall order such surplus to be deposited in the general fund."

1 SEC. 2. Chapter two hundred eighty-three A (283A), Code 1966, is  
 2 hereby amended by adding thereto the following section:

3 "There is hereby established a permanent revolving fund for the depart-  
 4 ment of public instruction to be known as the 'school lunch revolving  
 5 fund'. From this fund shall be paid the cost of warehousing, handling and  
 6 transportation of direct distribution of federal surplus commodities. The  
 7 fund shall be reimbursed by pro rata cost of items to receiving schools  
 8 and institutions. There is hereby appropriated from the general fund of the  
 9 state to the department of public instruction the sum of five thousand  
 10 (5,000) dollars for the purpose of carrying out this section.

11 If any surplus accrues to said revolving fund in excess of the original

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## CHAPTER 176

### VOCATIONAL EDUCATION ADVISORY COUNCIL

S.F. 544

AN ACT to establish a state advisory council for vocational education.

*Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:*

1 SECTION 1. Section two hundred fifty-eight point seven (258.7), Code  
 2 1966, is hereby repealed and the following enacted in lieu thereof:

3 "There is hereby established a state advisory council for vocational  
 4 education, consisting of thirteen members, which shall be appointed by the  
 5 governor. The term of each member shall be for three years, except that for  
 6 the initial appointments the governor shall specify the terms of each mem-  
 7 ber so that as nearly as possible, the terms of an equal number of members  
 8 shall expire on the first day of July of each year.

9 The advisory council shall serve in an advisory capacity to the state  
 10 board and shall perform such functions as may be necessary in order for  
 11 the state of Iowa to qualify for federal aids and grants to vocational educa-  
 12 tion.

13 The advisory council shall include members who are:

14 1. Familiar with the vocational needs and the problems of manage-  
 15 ment and labor in the state.

16 2. Representative of state industrial and economic development agencies.

17 3. Representative of community and junior colleges and other institu-  
 18 tions of higher education, area vocational schools, technical institutes, and  
 19 postsecondary or adult education institutions, which provide programs of  
 20 vocational or technical education and training.

21 4. Familiar with the administration of state and local vocational edu-  
 22 cation programs.

23 5. Persons having special knowledge, experience, or qualifications with  
24 respect to vocational education and who are not involved in the administra-  
25 tion of state or local vocational education programs.

26 6. Familiar with programs of technical and vocational education, includ-  
27 ing programs in comprehensive secondary schools.

28 7. Representative of local educational agencies.

29 8. Representative of school boards.

30 9. Representative of manpower and vocational education agencies in the  
31 state, including the comprehensive area manpower planning system of the  
32 state.

33 10. Representative of school systems with large concentrations of aca-  
34 demically, socially, economically, and culturally disadvantaged students.

35 11. Persons having special knowledge, experience, or qualifications, with  
36 respect to the special educational needs of physically or mentally handicap-  
37 ped persons.

38 12. Representative of the general public, and not qualified for member-  
39 ship under the preceding subsections, including a person representative of  
40 and familiar with the problems of the poor and disadvantaged.

41 13. Representative of prospective employers of vocationally trained stu-  
42 dents.

43 The council shall meet at the call of the chairman at least once each  
44 quarter of the year.

1 SEC. 2. This Act, being deemed of immediate importance, shall be  
2 in full force and effect upon publication in The Sac Sun, a newspaper pub-  
3 lished at Sac City, Iowa, and The New Hampton Tribune, a newspaper  
4 published at New Hampton, Iowa.

## CHAPTER 177

### STUDENTS AT MERGED AREA SCHOOLS

H. F. 71

AN ACT relating to inclusion of students in attendance at area vocational schools, area commu-  
nity colleges, and schools of professional nursing.

*Be It Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa:*

1 SECTION 1. Section two hundred sixty-one point two (261.2), subsection  
2 four (4), Code 1966, is hereby amended as follows:

3 1. By striking the word "or" from line six (6) and inserting in lieu thereof  
4 a comma.

5 2. By inserting in line six (6) after the word "colleges" the words  
6 " , area vocational schools, area community colleges, or schools of profes-  
7 sional nursing".
