CHAPTER 53.

PRAIRIE FIRES.

AN ACT to prevent the spreading of fires on the Prairies and in the timber in certain seasons of the year.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa, That if any person set fire to and suffering fire burn, or cause to be burned, any prairie or timber land, to get out beallowing such fire to escape from his control, between tween the 1st the first day of September in any year, and the first day of September of May following, he shall be deemed guilty of a misde-May. meanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by imprisonment in the County Jail not more than thirty days, or by fine not exceeding one hundred dollars.

SEC. 2. Nothing contained in this Act shall be construed to conflict with Section 4231 of the Revision of 1860.

CHAPTER. 54.

DISABILITY TO HOLD OFFICE.

AN ACT to amend Section six hundred and sixty-two (662) of the Revision of 1860.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Iowa, That Section six hundred and sixtytwo (662) of the Revision of 1860, be amended by adding thereto the following, viz:

10. The acceptance of a commission to any military office, either in the Militia of this State, or in the volunteer service of the United States, which requires the incumbent in the civil office to exercise his military duties out of the State for a period not less than sixty days.

SEC. 2. This Act being deemed of immediate importance shall be in force and take effect from and after its publication in the State Register, and Des Moines Daily Times.
