1 Section 1. 2005 Iowa Acts, chapter 169, section 2,
2 subsection 4, is amended by adding the following new
3 unnumbered paragraph:

4 NEW UNNUMBERED PARAGRAPH. Notwithstanding section 8.33,
5 moneys appropriated in this subsection that remain
6 unencumbered or unobligated at the close of the fiscal year
7 shall not revert but shall remain available for expenditure
8 for the purposes designated until the close of the succeeding

EXPLANATION

11 This bill revises and makes appropriations involving
12 veterans programs for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2005.

13 The bill provides that the unexpended or unobligated
14 portion of an appropriation made to the college student aid
15 commission in 2005 Iowa Acts, chapter 169, for purposes of the
16 national guard educational assistance program does not revert
17 at the close of the fiscal year but remains available for
18 expenditure for the program in the succeeding fiscal year.

19 The bill reduces an appropriation made to the Iowa veterans
20 home in 2005 Iowa Acts, chapter 175, by \$3 million and makes
21 new appropriations for other veterans programs in an amount
22 equivalent to the reduction.

23 The bill includes legislative intent to appropriate at
24 least \$3 million in funding from the rebuild Iowa
25 infrastructure fund to support necessary projects at the Iowa
26 veterans home.

27 The first new appropriation is for a new veterans
28 appreciation program for military veterans seriously injured
29 in a combat zone since September 11, 2001. This appropriation
30 is contingent upon enactment of new law codifying the new
31 program requirements. The bill also provides nonreversion
32 authority contingent upon enactment of the codified
33 provisions.

34 The other new appropriation is required to be transferred
35 to the Iowa finance authority to continue a home ownership

1 assistance program for persons who are or were eligible
2 members of the armed forces of the United States. This
3 appropriation does not revert until the close of fiscal year
4 2007-2008.

5 The bill also amends session law to extend the eligibility
6 period of the home ownership program by one year to June 30,
7 2007.

8 The bill takes effect upon enactment.

REVISING AND MAKING APPROPRIATIONS INVOLVING VETERANS PROGRAMS FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 2005, AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. 2005 Iowa Acts, chapter 169, section 2, subsection 4, is amended by adding the following new unnumbered paragraph:

NEW UNNUMBERED PARAGRAPH. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in this subsection that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the close of the fiscal year

NEW SUBSECTION. 4. HOME OWNERSHIP ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

For transfer to the Iowa finance authority to be used for continuation of the home ownership assistance program for persons who are or were eligible members of the armed forces of the United States, implemented pursuant to 2003 Iowa Acts, chapter 179, section 21, subsection 5, as amended by 2005 Iowa Acts, chapter 161, section 1, and chapter 115, section 37:
..... \$ 2,000,000

a. The Iowa finance authority shall give priority to processing the applications for assistance received after the original allotment of funding for the program was exhausted.

b. Notwithstanding section 8.33, moneys appropriated in this subsection that remain unencumbered or unobligated at the close of the fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain available for expenditure for the purposes designated until the close of the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2007.

For the purposes of this subsection, "eligible member of the armed forces of the United States" means a resident of this state who is or was a member of the national guard, reserve, or regular component of the armed forces of the United States who has served at least ninety days of active duty service during the period beginning September 11, 2001, and ending June 30, 2006 2007.

Sec. 5. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act, being deemed of immediate importance, takes effect upon enactment.
