A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to the use of a peace officer of the department
2 of public safety in an industrial dispute and providing an
3 effective date.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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HF 2337

1 Section 1. Section 80.24, Code Supplement 2005, is amended
2 to read as follows:

3 80.24 ~~MUNICIPAL-AND~~ INDUSTRIAL DISPUTES.

4 A peace officer of the department shall not be used or
5 called upon for service within any municipality ~~or-in-any~~
6 involving an industrial dispute unless a threat of imminent
7 violence exists, and then only either by order of the governor
8 or on the request of the chief executive officer of the
9 municipality or the sheriff of the county where the threat of
10 imminent violence exists if such request is approved by the
11 governor.

12 Sec. 2. CODE EDITOR DIRECTIVE. The Code editor is
13 directed to change the term "bureau of criminal
14 identification" or "bureau" to "division of criminal
15 investigation" or "division" wherever the term appears in the
16 Code or in the Acts pending codification.

17 Sec. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. The section of this Act amending
18 section 80.24, being deemed of immediate importance, takes
19 effect upon enactment.

20 EXPLANATION

21 This bill relates to the use of a peace officer of the
22 department of public safety in an industrial dispute.

23 The bill provides that a peace officer of the department of
24 public safety shall not be called upon for service within any
25 municipality involving an industrial dispute unless a threat
26 of imminent violence exists and the governor approves the use
27 of such peace officers in the dispute.

28 Current law provides that a peace officer of the department
29 of public safety shall not be called upon for service within
30 any municipality or in any industrial dispute unless a threat
31 of imminent violence exists and the governor approves the use
32 of such peace officers in the municipality or dispute.

33 The section of the bill amending the use of peace officers
34 of the department of public safety in an industrial dispute
35 takes effect upon enactment.

AN ACT

RELATING TO THE USE OF A PEACE OFFICER OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY IN AN INDUSTRIAL DISPUTE AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

Section 1. Section 80.24, Code Supplement 2005, is amended to read as follows:

80.24 MUNICIPAL-AND INDUSTRIAL DISPUTES.

A peace officer of the department shall not be used or called upon for service within any municipality ~~or-in-any~~ involving an industrial dispute unless a threat of imminent violence exists, and then only either by order of the governor or on the request of the chief executive officer of the municipality or the sheriff of the county where the threat of imminent violence exists if such request is approved by the governor.

Sec. 2. CODE EDITOR DIRECTIVE. The Code editor is directed to change the term "bureau of criminal identification" or "bureau" to "division of criminal investigation" or "division" wherever the term appears in the Code or in the Acts pending codification.
