**A BILL FOR**

1 An Act relating to a single point of entry long-term living  
2 resources system.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

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HF 2729

1 Section 1. LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS -- SINGLE POINT OF ENTRY  
2 LONG-TERM LIVING RESOURCES SYSTEM.

3 1. The general assembly finds that access to information  
4 regarding all components of the long-term living resources  
5 system is necessary to empower consumers in planning,  
6 evaluating, and making decisions to appropriately meet their  
7 individual long-term living needs. This access should be  
8 provided through a single point of entry into an integrated,  
9 seamless system that facilitates navigation of the variety of  
10 private and public resources available, minimizes service  
11 fragmentation, reduces duplication of administrative paperwork  
12 and procedures, enhances individual choice, supports informed  
13 decision making, and increases the cost-effectiveness of long-  
14 term living services and support systems.

15 2. a. A single point of entry long-term living resources  
16 system team is created, consisting of the following members:

17 (1) The director of the department of elder affairs, or  
18 the director's designee.

19 (2) The director of the department of human services, or  
20 the director's designee.

21 (3) The director of public health, or the director's  
22 designee.

23 (4) The director of the department of inspections and  
24 appeals, or the director's designee.

25 (5) The commissioner of insurance, or the commissioner's  
26 designee.

27 (6) The executive director of the Iowa finance authority,  
28 or the executive director's designee.

29 (7) The director of the department of veterans affairs, or  
30 the director's designee.

31 (8) The director of the department of workforce  
32 development, or the director's designee.

33 (9) A representative of the office of the governor.

34 (10) The director of an area agency on aging or the  
35 director's designee and a consumer member selected by the

2 (11) The state director of the AARP Iowa chapter or the  
3 state director's designee and a consumer member selected by  
4 the state director.

5 (12) The chairperson of the older Iowans legislature or  
6 the chairperson's designee and a consumer member selected by  
7 the chairperson.

8 (13) A representative of the Iowa hospital association.

9 (14) A representative of the Iowa pharmacy association.

10 (15) A representative of the Iowa health care association.

11 (16) A representative of the Iowa association of community  
12 providers.

13 (17) The director of the university of Iowa center on  
14 aging, or the director's designee.

15 (18) Two members of the senate and two members of the  
16 house of representatives, with not more than one member from  
17 each chamber being from the same political party.

18 b. The legislative members of the team shall serve in an  
19 ex officio, nonvoting capacity. The two senators shall be  
20 appointed by the president of the senate, after consultation  
21 with the leaders of the senate, and the two representatives  
22 shall be appointed by the speaker of the house, after  
23 consultation with the majority leader and the minority leader  
24 of the house of representatives.

25 c. Public members shall receive actual expenses incurred  
26 while serving in their official capacity and may also be  
27 eligible to receive compensation as provided in section 7E.6.

28 d. The team shall do all of the following:

29 (1) Hold at least four public meetings in at least four  
30 geographically balanced venues around the state to receive  
31 input regarding access to the long-term living resources  
32 system and recommendations for improved access.

33 (2) Make recommendations regarding the structure of and  
34 best means of providing a single point of entry to the long-  
35 term living resources system.

1 (3) Submit a report of the team's findings from the  
2 meetings described in subparagraph (1) and the team's  
3 recommendations for establishing a single point of entry to  
4 the long-term living resources system to the general assembly  
5 on or before December 1, 2007. The recommendations may  
6 provide for multiple access sites that are standardized and  
7 coordinated to provide for access to the single point of  
8 entry, a management information system that links the  
9 resources available in order to provide a single electronic  
10 point of entry to the long-term living resources system, a  
11 telephonic single point of entry, or suggestions for  
12 colocation or integration of long-term living resources system  
13 administration and services. The report shall also include  
14 recommendations for funding the single point of entry to the  
15 long-term living resources system through available grants or  
16 other sources.

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EXPLANATION

18 This bill creates a single point of entry long-term living  
19 resources system team to develop recommendations regarding the  
20 structure of and best means of providing a single point of  
21 entry to the long-term living resources system. The bill  
22 provides for the membership of the team and directs the team  
23 to submit a report of its findings from required meetings and  
24 its recommendations for establishing a single point of entry  
25 to a long-term living resources system to the general assembly  
26 on or before December 1, 2007. The bill provides that the  
27 recommendations may provide for multiple access sites that are  
28 standardized and coordinated to provide for access to the  
29 single point of entry, a management information system that  
30 links the resources available in order to provide a single  
31 electronic point of entry to the long-term living resources  
32 system, a telephonic single point of entry, or suggestions for  
33 colocation or integration of long-term living resources system  
34 administration and services. The report is also to include  
35 recommendations for funding the single point of entry to the

1 long-term living resources system through available grants or  
2 other sources.
