661—251.103(100B) Continuing training. Fire department members shall participate in at least 24 hours of continuing training annually, which may include, but is not limited to, the following subject matter areas:

- 1. Personal protective equipment and respiratory protection.
- 2. Structural firefighting techniques, including standard operating policies and procedures or standard operating guidelines.
 - 3. Ground ladders.
 - 4. Hose and hose appliances.
 - 5. Ventilation.
 - 6. Forcible entry.
 - 7. Search and rescue techniques.
 - 8. Firefighter safety.
 - 9. National Incident Management System or Incident Command System.
 - 10. Emergency vehicle driver-operator.
 - 11. Hazardous materials first responder—operations level.
 - 12. Emergency medical service (EMS) training.
- 13. Additional training based on standard operating policies and procedures or standard operating guidelines.
- 14. Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA)-related training, such as blood-borne pathogen protection.
- 15. Specialty training such as confined space entry, vehicle extrication, rescue techniques, wildland or agricultural firefighting techniques.
 - 16. Emergency response to terrorism.
 - 17. Any other training designed to meet local training needs.

NOTE: Training to meet this requirement may be provided by the fire service training bureau, a community college, a regional fire training facility, or a local fire department, or any combination thereof. [ARC 9928B, IAB 12/14/11, effective 2/1/12; ARC 5604C, IAB 5/5/21, effective 6/9/21]
