MICHIGAN RESPONSE TO COVID-19 OUTBREAK

Michigan Legislature. The Michigan Legislature suspended its legislative session on March 17, 2020, until March 25 in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. On March 10, Michigan reported the first confirmed cases of the virus. On the same day, Governor Gretchen Whitmer declared a State of Emergency. On March 16, the governor officially closed down state schools. The legislature has approved up to \$150.0 million in emergency funding.

Emergency Funding. On March 12, the Michigan Legislature approved Senate Bill <u>151</u>, which includes \$25.0 million in emergency funding related to COVID-19. On March 17, House Bill <u>4729</u> directed \$50.0 million to the Department of Health and Human Services. Another \$40.0 million was directed to other agencies. The remaining \$35.0 million will be in reserve if additional funding is needed.

Other. On March 12, Governor Whitmer <u>closed</u> public schools beginning on March 16 and extending through April 6. On March 16, the governor issued an executive <u>order</u> limiting access to establishments such as bars and restaurants until March 30.

Cases. As of March 19, there are 117 confirmed cases of COVID-19 in Michigan, with 3 deaths.
