## COVID-19 — MARYLAND — 3/26/2020

**Maryland Legislature.** The Maryland legislature adjourned on March 16, 2020, due to the COVID-19 pandemic. According to the *Washington Post*, this is the first time since the Civil War that the state's legislative body has adjourned early. Also notably, the legislature passed more than 650 bills in a three-day period prior to adjournment. The legislature passed several bills relating to the pandemic including:

- Extending temporary unemployment benefits.
- Granting the governor permission to use up to \$50.0 million of the state's rainy day fund.
- Further allowing the governor to use up to \$100.0 million from the state's reserves.

**Governor's Actions.** Governor Larry Hogan has ordered all public schools to remain closed until at least April 24, 2020, and has ordered all nonessential businesses to close. The governor has also announced \$175.0 million to assist small businesses and workers impacted by the pandemic. More information can be found <a href="https://example.com/here">here</a>. **COVID-19 Cases.** As of March 26, 2020, Maryland has 580 confirmed cases and has reported 4 deaths due to the virus.
