HIGHER EDUCATION RELIEF FUNDING — FINAL DISTRIBUTION

Final Distribution of Funding. On April 9, 2020, the U.S. Department of Education (USDOE) released the <u>final distribution</u> of the higher education funding from the Education Stabilization Fund in the federal Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act. The following table details the funding for lowa's public universities and community colleges.

Requirements for the Use of Funds. The funding will be distributed directly to the institutions. As the table shows, the institutions are required to spend at least 50.0% of the funds on emergency aid for students. That portion of the funding will be distributed to institutions "immediately," according to the USDOE.

The institutions will determine which students receive the grants. The USDOE encourages the institutions to prioritize students based on level of need and to set a maximum aid limit per student to allow wider distribution of funds. The USDOE also asks institutions with less need to consider sharing their allocations with other institutions that have greater need.

There is no maintenance of effort requirement for the higher education portion of the Education Stabilization Fund. Institutions must report the uses of the funding to the U.S. Secretary of Education.
