



EXECUTIVE ORDER NUMBER NINE

WHEREAS, in order to secure relief for two Iowa families for losses suffered in crashes of jet aircraft on their properties in 1968, I halted the movement and use of all federal vehicles and all federal aircraft issued to the Iowa Army and Air National Guard under Executive Order Number Eight, which I signed April 21, 1972;

WHEREAS, such action precipitated prompt and immediate action by federal authorities to justly settle claims presented by Mrs. Marie Tjernagel and Mrs. Emma McCarville and others affected by the disasters; and

WHEREAS, I have received assurance from federal authorities that the claimants will now receive just compensation;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Robert D. Ray, as Governor of the State of Iowa and acting by law as the Commander-in-Chief of the Iowa National Guard, under Section 29A.7 Code of Iowa, 1971, hereby rescind Executive Order Number Eight effective noon, Tuesday, April 25, 1972. This rescission will remain effective so long as I am satisfied that the proceedings to settle these claims continue to move promptly and in the best interests of the claimants.
