ADMINISTRATIVE RULES — FISCAL IMPACT SUMMARIES

January 8, 2019

lowa Code section 17A.4(4) requires the Legislative Services Agency (LSA) to analyze the fiscal impact of all administrative rules with an impact of \$100,000 or more and provide a summary of the impact to the Administrative Rules Review Committee (ARRC). Fiscal Impact Statements filed by State agencies can be found on our website at https://www.legis.iowa.gov/publications/fiscal/adminRulesFiscalImpact.

With each rule summary, the rulemaking type is indicated in parentheses following the ARC number. The acronyms have the following meanings: Notice of Intended Action (NOIA), Amended Notice of Intended Action (ANOIA), Notice of Termination (NOT), Adopted and Filed Emergency (AFE), Filed Emergency After Notice (FEAN), and Adopted and Filed (AF).

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Department of Human Services

Rule Summary

ARC 4165C (AF)

Allows behavior analysts and assistant behavior analysts who are licensed pursuant to lowa Code chapter 154D to be paid for behavioral health services provided to recipients of Medicaid. Allows provisionally licensed psychologists, temporarily licensed marital

and family therapists, and temporarily licensed mental health counselors who are licensed pursuant to lowa Code section <u>154D.7</u> payment for behavioral health services provided to recipients of Medicaid.

State or Federal Law Implemented: Iowa Code section <u>249A.4</u> and 2018 Iowa Acts, <u>SF 2418</u>, sections 135 and 136 (FY 2019 Health and Human Services Appropriations Act).

Fiscal Impact

Agency Response: Minimal fiscal impact. The changes may allow Medicaid members additional access to behavioral health services; however, any fiscal impact is expected to be minimal. Medicaid currently allows behavioral analysts and assistant behavioral analysts to provide services, but the supervising authority must do the billing. The rule changes will allow for these two professional types to bill Medicaid directly. Since the Medicaid program is already incurring these costs, minimal impact is expected. The changes adding provisionally licensed psychologists, temporarily licensed marital and family therapists, and temporarily licensed mental health counselors as eligible providers under Medicaid is expected to have minimal impact since it is consistent with current policy.

LSA Response: The LSA concurs.

ARC 4166C (AF)

Rule Summary

Updates the adoption subsidy program to revise outdated language, revise eligibility criteria for special needs children, clarify allowable expenses under special services, and add a provision to suspend an adoption subsidy under defined circumstances.

State or Federal Law Implemented: lowa Code section <u>234.6</u>, Social Security Act sections 473(a)(4)(A) and (B), and 45 C.F.R. 205.10.

Fiscal Impact

Agency Response: No fiscal impact.

LSA Response: The LSA concurs.

Rule Summary

Amends the subsidized guardianship program by removing a reference to a waiver and adding language to implement the federal Fostering Connections to Success and Increasing Adoptions Act. Adds a definition of "relative," revises eligibility, and ties maintenance payment maximums to the foster family care maintenance rates.

State or Federal Law Implemented: lowa Code section <u>234.6; 45 CFR 1356.21;</u> and the Social Security Act, sections 472 and 473(d)(3).

Fiscal Impact

Agency Response: The total estimated program cost in FY 2019 is \$198,000 (\$133,000 General Fund, \$65,000 federal), and the estimate for FY 2020 and beyond is \$592,000 (\$397,000 General Fund, \$195,000 federal).

LSA Response: The LSA concurs. The FY 2019 Health and Human Services Appropriation Act (<u>SF 2418</u>) includes a projected \$1.4 million in adoption subsidy projected savings, with \$133,000 for the subsidized guardianship program and the remainder for the Treatment Outcome Package (TOP) Screening Tool used by the Department.

With the 2008 federal Fostering Connections to Success and Increasing Adoptions Act, the federal government began phasing out the income eligibility requirements for Title IV-E Adoption Assistance, allowing more children to qualify for the federally funded portion of the program. States are required to spend any savings derived from this federal expansion on child welfare services. This unfunded adoption reinvestment obligation exists with or without this rule change, and is currently estimated at \$3.7 million. There are no federal deadlines yet for spending the savings dollars, but a delay

in finding a qualifying way to fulfill the State's required reinvestment spending will create a larger unfunded obligation in the future.

ARC 4208C (AF)

Rule Summary

Restores a three-month retroactive Medicaid coverage benefit for a Medicaid applicant who is otherwise Medicaid-eligible and is a resident of a nursing facility licensed under lowa Code chapter 135C.

State or Federal Law Implemented: Iowa Code section <u>249A.4</u> and <u>Senate File 2418</u> (FY 2019 Health and Human Services Appropriations Act).

Fiscal Impact

Agency Response: This change is estimated to cost the State \$140,000 in FY 2019 and FY 2020. Funding was provided as part of SF 2418.

LSA Response: The LSA concurs.

ARC 4209C (AF)

Rule Summary

Expands the eligibility criteria for Health and Disability waiver participation. Creates a process for requesting an increase in the waiver budget.

State or Federal Law Implemented: lowa Code section $\underline{249A.4}$ and $\underline{42~U.S.C.}$ §1396n(d).

Fiscal Impact

Agency Response: No fiscal impact.

LSA Response: The LSA concurs.

ARC 4219C (NOIA) & ARC 4220C (AFE)

Rule Summary

Removes the specific assistance standard amounts for State Supplementary Assistance and amends the Assistance Standards definition to include the legal citation to pass-along cost-of-living adjustments (COLA) in accordance with federal law. Cost-of-living adjustment changes are effective January 1 each year.

State or Federal Law Implemented: Iowa Code section <u>249A.4</u>, <u>20 CFR §416.2095</u>, and 20 CFR §416.2096.

Fiscal Impact

Agency Response: Minimal fiscal impact. These annual, federal changes include various updates to personal needs allowance (PNAs), member copayments, and cost-of-living adjustments (COLAs), such as:

- A \$4 increase in the Residential Care Facilities (RCF) PNA, from \$99 to \$103. This increase is based on a 2.8% COLA increase.
- A Family Life Home PNA increase of \$17, which is offset by the \$4 increase in the PNA deduction and \$21 increase in Supplementary Security Income (SSI) payment. The recipient will pay up to \$17 more due to the \$21 increase in income and the \$4 increase in the PNA.
- Copayments for RCF recipients are estimated to increase to \$1.71, an increase of \$0.81 compared to the previous copayment amount of \$0.90.
- Maximum monthly payments for recipients of Dependent Person assistance will
 increase by \$11, for \$387 to \$398. Each Dependent assistance recipient will receive
 up to an \$11 increase, resulting in an increase in State expenditures. This increase is
 expected to be offset by the declining number of anticipated recipients. Additionally,
 most recipients do not qualify for the maximum payment amount.

LSA Response: The LSA concurs.

ARC 4207C (AF)

Rule Summary

Requires the Mental Health and Disability Services (MHDS) regions to initiate new core services, expand the core services the regions currently provide, meet new access

standards for these services, and include the service changes in their service, budget planning, and reporting by a specified date. The regions must also collaborate to ensure that core services are available in minimum numbers strategically located throughout the State. Establishes new and revised service standards for providers of comprehensive crisis services, subacute mental health services, and intensive mental health services. Provides a broader and more accessible statewide array of crisis and intensive mental health services to individuals with serious mental illness and other individuals experiencing a mental health or substance use crisis.

State or Federal Law Implemented: Iowa Code section <u>225C.6</u> and <u>HF 2456</u> (Mental Health, Complex Service Needs Workgroup Report Act).

Fiscal Impact

Agency Response: The increased utilization of services due to the changes made in HF 2456 is estimated to increase General Fund Medicaid expenditures by \$821,000 in FY 2019 and \$6.0 million in FY 2020. In addition, the changes are also estimated to increase regional MHDS expenditures by \$4.3 million in FY 2019 and \$10.0 million in FY 2020. Senate File 2418 (FY 2019 Health and Human Services Appropriations Act) provided \$876,000 to fund the FY 2019 increase in Medicaid expenditures and Department of Inspections and Appeals survey and certification of subacute facilities. The increase in regional MHDS expenditures will primarily be covered by current county mental health property tax fund balances.

LSA Response: The LSA concurs.

ARC 4180C (AF)

Rule Summary

Requires that the Department of Administrative Services establish rules and procedures requiring applicants applying for both nonmerit and merit-covered Executive Branch positions to disclose in the application for employment whether the applicant has filed a registration statement pursuant to the federal Foreign Agents Registration Act of 1938.

State or Federal Law Implemented: Iowa Code sections <u>8A.403</u> and <u>8A.413(5A)</u> and 2018 Iowa Acts, <u>SF 2323</u> (State Officials and Employees—Foreign Agent Registration Act).

Fiscal Impact

Agency Response: No fiscal impact.

LSA Response: The LSA concurs.

ARC 4181C (AF)

Rule Summary

Updates capitol complex hours of operations, as well as policies and procedures for making the Capitol building available to the public while the Legislature is in session.

State or Federal Law Implemented: lowa Code sections <u>8A.322</u> and <u>17A.7</u>.

Fiscal Impact

Agency Response: No fiscal impact.

LSA Response: The LSA concurs.

ARC 4182C (AF)

Rule Summary

Provides updates on procurement policies and procedures relating to state employee driving guidelines, procurement of goods and services of general use, and purchasing standards for service contracts.

State or Federal Law Implemented: lowa Code sections 8A.104, 8A.311, 17A.7,

26.3, and 26.9.

Fiscal Impact Agency Response: No fiscal impact.

Inspection Program. The federal regulations relate to roasting chickens, trichinae

destruction requirements, and canned meats.

State or Federal Law Implemented: Iowa Code chapter 189A and Iowa Code section

<u>159.5</u>.

Fiscal Impact Agency Response: No fiscal impact.

LSA Response: The LSA concurs.

ARC 4151C (NOIA)

Rule Summary Establishes two noxious weed priority lists. One list identifies the noxious weeds for

eradication and the other list identifies the noxious weeds for control purposes.

State or Federal Law Implemented: House File 2422 (Management of Noxious

Weeds Act).

Fiscal Impact Agency Response: No fiscal impact.

qualification from 25 years to 10 years or more of work experience that is satisfactory to

the Board, updates references to the now computer-based Fundamentals of Engineering and Principles of Practice of Engineering examinations, and updates the continuing education requirements for biennial licensure renewal. Also amends rules

continuing education requirements for biennial licensure renewal. Also amends rules related to comity applications, practical experience requirements, recordkeeping, compliance review, and the management of complaints and professional misconduct.

State or Federal Law Implemented: lowa Code chapter <u>542B</u>.

Rule Summary Allows the lowa Finance Authority (IFA) to allocate funds to financial institutions or other

lenders to finance the purchase by individuals of manufactured homes sited on leased land in lowa. The proposed rules have been modified since they were first noticed to allow nondepository lenders to participate in conjunction with a financial institution that

is a depository institution.

State or Federal Law Implemented: 2018 Iowa Acts, HF 2480 (Manufactured

Housing Revolving Loan Fund Act).

Fiscal Impact Agency Response: No fiscal impact.

LSA Response: The LSA concurs.

ARC 4196C (NOIA)

Rule Summary Updates the Authority's address to 1963 Bell Avenue, Suite 200, Des Moines, Iowa,

throughout its administrative rules.

State or Federal Law Implemented: lowa Code section 16.5.

Fiscal Impact Agency Response: No fiscal impact.

LSA Response: The LSA concurs.

ARC 4210C (AF)

Rule Summary Updates and clarifies the allocation of private activity bonds and the application process.

The proposed rules have been modified since they were first noticed to update the

address of the Authority.

State or Federal Law Implemented: lowa Code chapter 7C.

Fiscal Impact Agency Response: No fiscal impact.

LSA Response: The LSA concurs.

ARC 4211C (AF)

Rule Summary Implements changes required by 2018 Iowa Acts, <u>SF 512</u> (Water Quality Act), including

the creation of the Water Quality Financial Assistance Fund, which transfers 40.0% of the balance of the Fund to the Wastewater and Drinking Water Treatment Financial Assistance Program and 45.0% to the Water Quality Financing Program. The proposed rules have been modified since they were first noticed to include additional protections

for communities that rely on ground water as their source of drinking water.

State or Federal Law Implemented: Senate File 512 (Water Quality Act).

Fiscal Impact Agency Response: No fiscal impact.

LSA Response: The LSA concurs. No funding has been deposited into the Water Quality Financial Assistance Fund at this time. <u>Fiscal Note</u> estimates for FY 2019 indicate a transfer of \$2.0 million to the Water Quality Financial Assistance Fund, but at

this time, no transfer has been made.

Department of Education

ARC 4155C (NOIA)

Rule Summary Establishes a summer college credit program to be made available to eligible high

school students in grades 9 through 12 during the summer months under the Future Ready lowa initiative. Establishes a policy framework for these programs, including minimum components for a program; a department review process; a funding

mechanism; and student, course, and institution eligibility criteria.

State or Federal Law Implemented: 2017 lowa Acts, chapter <u>172</u>, section 50, as

amended by 2018 Iowa Acts, chapter 1163, section 4.

Fiscal Impact Agency Response: No fiscal impact.

LSA Response: The LSA concurs in part. While there is no additional fiscal impact to the State as a result of this rulemaking, 2018 lowa Acts, chapter 1163, section 4,

includes an FY 2019 General Fund appropriation of \$600,000 that will fund the new initiative.

ARC 4156C (NOIA)

Rule Summary

Adds an additional job classification to the shared operational functions eligible for supplementary weighting and extends the eligibility period. Changes district eligibility for additional weighting under concurrent enrollment for certain career and technical education courses.

State or Federal Law Implemented: <u>HF 633</u> (School District Supplementary Weighting — Shared Operational Functions Act) and <u>SF 475</u> (Regulation of Primary and Secondary Education — Miscellaneous Changes Act).

Fiscal Impact

Agency Response: Fiscal impact cannot be determined. This may impact jobs that have shared functions and it may impact local districts' budgets.

LSA Response: The LSA concurs in part. The legislation the rulemaking implements (<u>HF 633</u>) may increase State school aid from the General Fund by \$1.0 million in FY 2020.

In FY 2019, 232 school districts are participating in operational sharing of certain job classifications with other school districts or AEAs. Under previous law, 139 of the 232 districts would have been ineligible for operational sharing in FY 2020, reducing State aid by an estimated \$12.3 million.

Under current law, with the extension of the operational sharing provision and the inclusion of social workers as an allowable shared operational function, it is estimated that weighting for operational sharing may increase by 5.0%, increasing State aid by \$1.0 million. For more information, see the Fiscal Note for HF 633.

Additional legislation the rulemaking implements (<u>SF 475</u>) may further increase State school aid from the General Fund by between \$118,000 and \$183,000 by generating additional supplementary weighting for concurrent enrollment classes for school districts with less than 600 students enrolled. For more information, see the <u>Fiscal Note</u> for <u>SF 475</u>.

ARC 4157C (NOIA)

Rule Summary

Requires school districts to adopt protocols for suicide prevention and postvention and for the identification of adverse childhood experiences and strategies to mitigate toxic stress response.

State or Federal Law Implemented: 2018 Iowa Acts, <u>SF 2113</u> (School Personnel, Child Suicide In-Service Training Act).

Fiscal Impact

Agency Response: Fiscal impact cannot be determined.

LSA Response: The LSA concurs. The costs will be determined by the individual districts, based on decisions regarding training resources and the use of school time or noncontract time to provide the training. It is not possible to estimate the impact of choices made by individual school districts.

ARC 4158C (NOIA)

Rule Summary

Removes the statewide cap on students enrolled in online schools, rearranges substantive requirements, and adds a requirement that the director maintain a list of private providers that meet the Department's standards for online courses. Providers desiring to be added to the list are to apply to the Department as required. Expands lowa Learning Online to allow participation of students who receive private instruction. Permits school districts to provide coursework primarily online to open enrolled students.

State or Federal Law Implemented: Iowa Code sections <u>256.7</u>(32), <u>256.41</u>, <u>256.42</u>, <u>256.43</u>, and 2018 Iowa Acts, <u>SF 475</u> (Education Omnibus Act), <u>SF 2131</u> (Iowa Learning Online Initiative, Students Receiving Private Instruction, Online Working Group Act), and SF 2415 (FY 2019 Education Appropriations Act).

Fiscal Impact

Agency Response: Fiscal impact cannot be determined. The fiscal impact of this rule depends on which districts take advantage of the new opportunities to offer online learning.

LSA Response: The LSA concurs. School districts could experience additional costs depending on the choices that the districts make in implementing online education, but specific estimates cannot be determined at this time.

ARC 4159C (NOIA)

Rule Summary

Allows individual pupils who participate in open enrollment to online education to participate in up to two cocurricular or extracurricular activities at their resident district. The changes allow districts to deduct up to \$200 per activity off of the open enrollment tuition out.

State or Federal Law Implemented: lowa Code section 282.18.

Fiscal Impact

Agency Response: No fiscal impact.

LSA Response: The LSA concurs. The number of students open-enrolling and who may choose to return to their resident districts for the purpose of cocurricular or extracurricular activities cannot be estimated at this time. No fiscal impact is expected.

ARC 4160C (NOIA)

Rule Summary

Implements changes to how categorical funding for lowa school districts can be expended, including but not limited to:

- Allowable school district use of materials purchased for a home school assistance program.
- Allowable uses of at-risk, returning dropout, early intervention, dropout prevention, and child care funds.
- Changes regarding applications to the School Budget Review Committee for a modified supplemental amount (MSA) for at-risk, returning dropout, and dropout prevention programs.
- Allows school districts to establish an unpaid meals account in its School Nutrition
- Addresses textbook purchases for nonpublic schools that cease operating.

State or Federal Law Implemented: Iowa Code sections <u>257.41</u>, <u>297.22</u>, <u>298A.8</u>, and <u>298A.12</u>; and <u>HF 2441</u> (Regulation of Primary and Secondary Education and School District Funding Act) and <u>HF 2467</u> (School Meal Debt and School Meal Programs Act).

Fiscal Impact

Agency Response: Fiscal impact is unknown.

LSA Response: The LSA concurs. Although there is no expected fiscal impact to the State, per the <u>Fiscal Note</u> for <u>HF 2467</u>, local School Food Authorities may have some increase in ongoing staff costs. Additionally, per the <u>Fiscal Note</u> for <u>HF 2441</u>, some school districts may generate a different amount of MSA for at-risk and dropout prevention programs; however, the impact on property taxes cannot be determined at this time.

ARC 4163C (AF)

Rule Summary

Makes nonsubstantive clarifications to rules pertaining to career and technical education. Describes the process for programs that do not meet requirements. Implements provisions of HF 648 (Career and Technical Education Programs and

Partnerships Act) relating to disbursement, monitoring, and allowable uses of State

career and technical education funds.

State or Federal Law Implemented: lowa Code chapter 258.

Fiscal Impact Agency Response: No fiscal impact.

LSA Response: The LSA concurs.

ARC 4164C (AF)

Rule Summary Establishes the minimum components for career information systems used by districts

to support individual career and academic plans.

State or Federal Law Implemented: lowa Code section 279.61.

Fiscal Impact Agency Response: No fiscal impact.

LSA Response: The LSA concurs.

Board of Educational Examiners

ARC 4147C (NOIA)

Rule Summary Clarifies the section of the Board's Code of Professional Conduct and Ethics pertaining

to the violation of contractual obligations to eliminate sanctions for a teacher who provides notice requesting release from a contract prior to, in the vast majority of cases, June 30. Also removes sanctions for an administrator who hires a teacher under contract at another district or accredited nonpublic school as long as that teacher

provided the required notice on the timeline referenced above.

State or Federal Law Implemented: lowa Code section 272.2(1).

Fiscal Impact Agency Response: No fiscal impact.

LSA Response: The LSA concurs.

Department of Inspections and Appeals

ARC 4162C (NOIA)

Rule Summary Adopts the 2018 Guidelines for Design and Construction of Residential Health, Care,

and Support Facilities (Facility Guidelines Institute) as the minimum design and construction standards for licensed nursing facilities. Provides consistency in the design

and construction of licensed nursing facilities.

State or Federal Law Implemented: lowa Code sections 10A.104 and 135C.14.

- Item 8 establishes electronic submittal of the annual emissions inventories required under the Title V Operating Permit program beginning with the reports due by March 31, 2019.
- Item 12 adopts revised New Source Performance Standards (NSPS) and adopts the changes EPA made to the NSPS test methods, as explained in the description above for Items 1, 6, and 15.
- Item 13 adopts federal amendments to the federal National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants (NESHAP) for the following source categories:
 - Phosphoric acid manufacturing and phosphate fertilizer production.
 - · Offsite waste and recovery operations.
 - Chemical recovery combustion sources at kraft, soda, sulfite, and stand-alone semichemical pulp mills.
 - Portland cement manufacturing.
 - · Wool fiberglass manufacturing.
- Item 14 adopts the federal emission guidelines for existing sewage sludge incineration units.

State or Federal Law Implemented: Iowa Code section 455B.133.

Fiscal Impact Agency Response: No fiscal impact. The proposed changes will have a neutral fiscal

impact on affected facilities, the public, counties, and local governments. Some of the rulemakings may benefit the private sector because they will streamline current air
