Emergency Rules	Deer Hunting Preserves: 1. Changes the regulation of whitetail deer hunting preserves from the Department of Natural Resources to the Department of Agriculture and Land Stewardship.	Deer Hunting Preserves Revenue: There are six whitetail deer hunting preserves in lowa paying \$1,000 fee resulting in \$6,000 in revenue per year.
	 Requires persons with a whitetail deer hunting preserve to apply for a whitetail deer hunting preserve license with an annual fee of \$1,000 and to submit two copies of a plat map detailing the land and includes the proposed hunting preserve. The Department of Agriculture and Land Stewardship will inspect the property identified in the 	Farm Deer Registration Revenue: There are 300 farm deer breeders in lowa that will pay a \$100 fee for revenue of \$30,000 per year. Additional revenue will be raised from the fence inspection fees, however, that cannot be determined at this time.
