The Service Committee met on May 14, 1984 and makes the following recommendations to the Legislative Council:

- 1. That Mr. Craig Jontz be employed by the Legislative Service Bureau as an Attorney I at Pay Grade 29, Step 1.
- 2. That Ms. Autumn McGrean be employed by the Legislative Service Bureau as a Word Processor I at Pay Grade 13, Step 1.
- 3. That the Computer Committee be authorized to initiate an advertising and interviewing process for employment of a systems manager for the legislative computer system. The Computer Committee will report the results of this process to the Service Committee and the Legislative Council in June.
- 4. That the Legislative Fiscal Bureau be allowed to expend unencumbered moneys from funds appropriated to it for the 1983-1984 fiscal year for reprogramming costs in connection with changes being made in the State Comptroller's Budget Book in order to access information from the State Comptroller's office during the 1985 legislative session.
