
Empower Rural Iowa — FY 2022

In 2018, Governor Reynolds created the Empower Rural lowa (ERI) initiative through Executive Order, organizing three task forces to study issues affecting lowa's rural economies and to make recommendations to the Governor and General Assembly. 2019 lowa Acts, House File 772 (Empower Rural lowa Act), created incentives for the ERI initiative within the lowa Economic Development Authority (IEDA) to support lowa's rural economies. The Center for Rural Revitalization, housed within the IEDA, is responsible for the day-to-day operations of the ERI program. The ERI task forces formed under this program include the following:

- Investing in Rural lowa Task Force Rural housing shortage, derelict and dilapidated buildings, online business presence, business transition planning, and entrepreneurship.
- **Growing Rural Iowa Task Force** Leadership development in rural communities, creating welcoming communities, and attracting and retaining residents or workers.
- Connecting Rural lowa Task Force Financing broadband connectivity, leveraging connectivity, and remote worker readiness.
