Development of Strong Collaborative Partnerships

- Working with Monroe SUCCESS
 Case Manager and Community
 School Coordinator
- •Integrate Amerigroup Subject Matter Experts into Monroe Elementary Family Nights
- •Connect with existing Monroe community partners Iowa Wild, Mediacom, United Way of Central Iowa
- Iowa Legal Aid in-school clinic days
- •Leverage Primary Health Care, Inc. community health work





Interventions Starting with Nutrition, Housing

- •Green Bronx Machine (Anthemwide STEM programming specific to nutrition)
- •Expand Double Up Food Bucks to local, ethnically diverse groceries that accept SNAP. Leverage schools to distribute flyers and vouchers.
- •Leverage food banks and pantries in the areas nearest our members





Housing Stability & Homelessness Diversion Fund

- •Funds used for rental application fees, pay partial rent, utility bills of connection fees, temporary transportation assistance, automobile repairs, purchase beds and linens.
- •Goal: Assist up to 50 Amerigroup Iowa members who are in crisis.
- Actual through November: 124 Amerigroup Iowa members assisted
- •56% of participants received housing support
- •34% of participants received mattress, beds and other household goods
- •Transportation support is the third most common need.

Scaling Housing Stability Fund



Phase One: Providing Immediate COVID-19 Relief

- Increased outreach to staff at Samuelson Elementary, Callanan Middle, Jessie Taylor preschool and Woodlawn preschool, all IHH's in Polk County and several community based organizations.
- Identified growing housing risks in Louisa, Johnson, Linn, Black Hawk, Tama, Marshall and Woodbury County in May
- Partnered with Iowa Association of Community Action Directors to distribute housing stability funds to 62 households in June - August.
- Funding of last resort behind federal and state relief funds
- Opportunity to create new partnerships with Community-Based Organizations outside of the CHAMP pilot project in Des Moines



Scaling Housing Stability fund – Phase Three: Sustainable Growth



- Partnership with 4 Community-based organizations in 4 counties this fall
- Adding 20 counties in 2021
- Increased CBO participation in our Community Resource Link powered by Aunt Bertha
- Coordinating Homelessness diversion and Housing Stability with Amerigoup Population Health Case Management Model



Addressing Gaps in Youth Transitions from Foster Care



- Partnership with Youth Policy Institute of Iowa
- Partnership with Achieving Maximum Potential (AMP)
 Youth Councils, an affiliate of YSS
- Establish a new "Kinship Fundz" to address the needs of youth in out of home placement
