



Funding



Only about \$6.5 million of the \$30.5 million Main AG Office budget is a General Fund appropriation

Funding Challenges

- The \$6.5 million General Fund appropriation funds only a small portion of the AG Office including existing prosecutors and litigators.
- The other primary funding sources—agency reimbursements or consumer protection funds—can't be repurposed to pay for prosecutors or protecting against federal overreach.

Protecting Victims

 Conducting top down, bottom up audit of Victim Assistance Programs, including listening sessions with stakeholders around the State.






Keeping Iowans Safe


 Iowa needs more prosecutors in the Attorney General's Statewide Prosecutions Section to assist county attorneys with major crimes.

Statewide Prosecutions Section

Over the last 25 years, the AG's prosecutors have decreased 27% while the major crimes they need to prosecute have nearly doubled.

	1997	Now
Homicides in Iowa	40	70 (75% Increase)
Rapes in Iowa	663	1331 (101% Increase)
AG Prosecutors for Violent Crimes	11	7 (27% Decrease)

75% increase could justify 8 more AG Prosecutors.

We are seeking 6.

Hiring More Prosecutors

\$1,611,411 and 11 FTEs would fund:

- 6 attorneys
- 3 investigators
- 2 paralegals

This would properly staff the Statewide Prosecutions Section, including a new Cold Case Unit and Special Victims Unit.

Pushing Back on Overreach

\$920,514 and 6 FTEs would fund:

- 4 attorneys
- 2 paralegals

This would provide resources to protect the State's interests against federal overreach, protect lowa farmers, and defend lowa's statutes.

Improving Technology

- Basic technology infrastructure and cybersecurity has been neglected.
- Maintaining the \$202,060 line-item for Cybersecurity and IT Infrastructure and adding \$278,503 from TRF as recommended by the Governor will help us to start to address the problem.
